ORDER TO SHOW CAUSE

The Securities and Exchange Commission issued an Order Instituting Proceedings (OIP) on March 12, 2014, pursuant to Section 15(b) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 and Section 203(f) of the Investment Advisers Act of 1940. Respondent George Louis Theodule (Theodule) did not attend the April 11, 2014, prehearing conference, because he was in transit between federal prisons. He was personally served on April 4, 2014, and as of the date of this order, he had not filed his Answer, which was due by April 24, 2014. See OIP at 3; 17 C.F.R. §§ 141(a)(2)(i), .220(b).

Accordingly, it is ORDERED that Theodule shall SHOW CAUSE by May 12, 2014, why this proceeding should not be determined against him for failing to file an Answer to the OIP. See OIP at 3; 17 C.F.R. §§ 201.155(a)(2), .220(f). If Theodule fails to respond to this Order, file an Answer, or otherwise defend the proceeding, he will be deemed in default and the proceeding will be determined against him. See OIP at 3; 17 C.F.R. §§ 201.155(a)(2), .220(f).
