PROCEDURAL ORDER

Respondent was served with the Order Instituting Proceedings on April 13, 2015, and his Answer was due by May 6, 2015. To date, Respondent has not filed an Answer.

On May 12, 2015, the Division of Enforcement filed a status report explaining that it will not be filing a joint prehearing conference statement pursuant to my April 16, 2015, order, because Respondent and his counsel are not communicating with the Division, meaning there has been no prehearing conference without the hearing officer on which to report. The Division's filing also indicates its intention to file a motion for default by May 29, 2015.

I ORDER the following procedural schedule as to a motion for default:

May 29, 2015: The Division's motion for default is due.

June 12, 2015: Respondent's opposition is due.

June 19, 2015: The Division's reply, if any, is due.

The Division's motion shall include proposed findings of fact and conclusions of law, with an analysis of each element necessary to establish liability under the securities laws; and legal authority and evidentiary support—consistent with *Gary L. McDuff*, Securities Exchange Act of 1934 (Exchange Act) Release No. No. 74806, 2015 SEC LEXIS 1657, at \*6-14 (Apr. 23, 2015)—for the sanctions sought against Respondent. See *Rapoport v. SEC*, 682 F.3d 98, 215 (D.C. Cir. 2012); *Ross Mandell*, Exchange Act Release No. 71668, 2014 SEC LEXIS 849, at \*7-9 (Mar. 7, 2014).

The parties' submissions and any evidence or documents in support shall be filed with the Commission's Office of the Secretary in hard-copy paper format, pursuant to 17 C.F.R. §§ 201.151, .152. If practicable, electronic courtesy copies of the parties' briefs and exhibits should be emailed to [alj@sec.gov](mailto:alj@sec.gov). Electronic copies of briefs should be provided in both PDF text-

searchable and MS Word format. Electronic copies of exhibits should not be combined into a single PDF file, but submitted as separate attachments.
