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

JUDGMENT OF PERMANENT INJUNCTION AND OTHER RELIEF AGAINST DEFENDANT CRAIG L. SMITH

Plaintiff Securities and Exchange Commission ("Commission") having filed and served upon Defendant Craig L. Smith ("Smith") a Summons and Complaint in this action; Smith having entered a general appearance and consented to the Court's jurisdiction over him and to the subject matter over this action, having been fully advised and informed of his right to a judicial determination of this matter, having waived the entry of findings of fact and conclusions of law as provided by Rule 52 of the Federal Rules of Civil Procedure, having consented to the entry of this Judgment of Permanent Injunction and Other Relief ("Judgment"), without admitting or denying the allegations in the Complaint, except as specifically set forth herein and in his Consent to Entry of Judgment of Permanent Injunction and Other Relief ("Consent"); no notice of hearing upon the entry of this Judgment being necessary; and this Court being fully

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advised:

I.

IT IS ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED that Defendant Smith, and his agents, servants, employees, attorneys, and those persons in active concert or participation with any of them who receive actual notice of this Judgment, by personal service or otherwise, and each of them, are permanently restrained and enjoined from, directly or indirectly, in connection with the purchase or sale of any security, by the use of any means or instrumentality of interstate commerce, or of the mails, or of any facility of any national securities exchange:

- A. employing any device, scheme, or artifice to defraud;
- B. making any untrue statement of a material fact or omitting to state a material fact necessary in order to make the statements made, in the light of the circumstances under which they were made, not misleading; or
- C. engaging in any act, practice, or course of business which operates or would operate as a fraud or deceit upon any person in violation of Section 10(b) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 ("Exchange Act"), 15 U.S.C. § 78j(b), and Rule 10b-5 thereunder, 17 C.F.R. § 240.10b-5.

II.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED, AND DECREED that Defendant Smith is liable for disgorgement of \$47,437, representing profits gained as a result of the conduct alleged in the Complaint, plus prejudgment interest thereon of \$13,386.83 as of June 1, 2004, and thereafter accruing at a rate of \$9.23 per day. Smith shall satisfy this obligation within thirty days of entry of this Judgment by certified check, bank cashier's check, or United States postal money order payable to the Securities and Exchange Commission. The payment shall be delivered or mailed to the Office of Financial Management, Securities and Exchange Commission, Operations Center, 6432 General Green Way, Mail Stop 0-3, Alexandria, Virginia 22312, and shall be

accompanied by a letter identifying Craig L. Smith as a defendant in this action; setting forth the title and civil action number of this action and the name of this Court; and specifying that payment is made pursuant to this Judgment. By making this payment, Smith relinquishes all legal and equitable right, title, and interest in such funds, and no part of the funds shall be returned to Smith.

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#### IIL.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED, AND DECREED that Defendant Smith is liable for a civil penalty of \$25,000 pursuant to Section 21A of the Exchange Act, 15 U.S.C. § 78u-1. Smith shall satisfy this obligation within one year of entry of this Judgment by certified check, bank cashier's check, or United States postal money order payable to the Securities and Exchange Commission. The payment shall be delivered or mailed to the Office of Financial Management, Securities and Exchange Commission, Operations Center, 6432 General Green Way, Mail Stop 0-3, Alexandria, Virginia 22312, and shall be accompanied by a letter identifying Craig L. Smith as a defendant in this action; setting forth the title and civil action number of this action and the name of this Court; and specifying that payment is made pursuant to this Judgment. By making this payment, Smith relinquishes all legal and equitable right, title, and interest in such funds, and no part of the funds shall be returned to Smith.

#### IV.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED that during the pendency of this action against any defendant, Defendant Smith shall remain subject to the discovery provisions of the Federal Rules of Civil Procedure which apply to parties, and, that Defendant Smith shall appear for his deposition or testify as a witness at any trial of this action or at any related proceeding. Failure to comply with the foregoing will subject Defendant Smith to the remedies and sanctions set forth in Rule 37 of the Federal Rules of Civil Procedure and all other available remedies.

V.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED, AND DECREED that the Consent

is incorporated herein with the same force and effect as if fully set forth herein, and that Defendant shall comply with all of the undertakings and agreements set forth therein. VI. IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED, AND DECREED that this Court shall retain jurisdiction of this matter for the purposes of enforcing the terms of this Judgment. VII. There being no just reason for delay, pursuant to Rule 54(b) of the Federal Rules of Civil Procedure, the Clerk is ordered to enter this Judgment forthwith and without further notice.
