FINAL JUDGMENT OF PERMANENT INJUNCTION AND OTHER RELIEF AS TO JAMES J. CAPRIO

Plaintiff Securities and Exchange Commission ("Commission"), having commenced this action by filing its Complaint, and Defendant James J. Caprio ("Caprio") having in the Consent of James J. Caprio ("Consent") entered a general appearance herein, admitted the jurisdiction of this Court over him and over the subject matter of this action, waived service ofprocess, waived the filing of an Answer to the Complaint and the entry of findings of fact and conclusions of law pursuant to Rule 52 of the Federal Rules of Civil Procedure, waived any right he might have to appeal from the entry of this Final Judgment, and, without admitting or denying any of the allegations of the Complaint, except as to jurisdiction, which he admits, and without trial, argument, or adjudication of any issue of fact or law, having consented to the entry of this Final Judgment, and it appearing that this Court has jurisdiction over Caprio and the subject matter of this action, and the Court being folly advised in the premises:

I.

IT IS ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED that Caprio is permanently restrained and enjoined from violating Sections 5(a) and 5(c) of the Securities Act of 1933 ("Securities Act") and Section 13(d) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 ("Exchange Act") and Rules13d-1 and 13d-2 promulgated thereunder.

II.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED that Caprio pay a civil penalty in the amount of \$125,00 pursuant to Section 20(d) of the Securities Act and Section 21(d)(3) of the Exchange Act. Payment shall be made in seven installments as follows: (i) \$50,000 within thirty (30) business days after entry of the Final Judgment; (ii) \$12,500 within 90 calendar days after entry of the Final Judgment; (iii) \$12,500 within 180 calendar days after entry of the Final Judgment; (iv) \$12,500 within 270 calendar days after entry of the Final Judgment; (v) \$12,500 within 360 calendar days after entry of the final judgment; (vi) \$12,500 within 450 calendar days after entry of the final judgment; and (vii) \$12,500 within 540 calendar days after entry of the final judgment. Each payment shall be made by bank cashier's check, certified check, United States postal money order, or bank money order payable to the "Securities and Exchange Commission." Each payment shall be hand-delivered or mailed to the Office of the Comptroller, Securities and Exchange Commission, Operations Center, 6432 General Green Way, Mail Stop O-3, Alexandria, Virginia 22312. Each payment shall be accompanied by a letter that identifies Caprio as the defendant on whose behalfthe payment is being made, the caption and case number of this action, the name of this Court, and the Commission's internal tile number for this matter (HO-09014).
