By email dated August 29, 2017, you clarified your request by asking that we search each SEC Commissioner (including the Chairman), the Director and/or Acting Director of the Division of Enforcement and the Director and/or Acting Director of the Office of Compliance Inspections and Examinations.

Based on the information you provided in your letter, we conducted a thorough search of the SEC's various systems of records and consulted with various staff and program offices, but did not locate or identify any information responsive to your request.

If you still have reason to believe that the SEC maintains the type of information you seek, please provide us with additional information, which could prompt another search. Otherwise, we conclude that no responsive information exists and we consider this request to be closed.
