**AMENDED FINAL JUDGMENT SETTING DISGORGEMENT AND  
CIVIL PENALTIES AGAINST DEFENDANT ALLEN E. WEINTRAUB**

**THIS MATTER** is before the Court on the motion of Plaintiff Securities and Exchange Commission for Amended Final Judgment against Allen Weintraub (D.E. # **62**). Weintraub previously agreed to the Court's entry of a Final Judgment Setting Disgorgement and Civil Penalties against Defendant Allen E. Weintraub (D.E. # 60) ("Final Judgment"). The Final Judgment ordered Weintraub to pay \$1,050,000 in disgorgement, prejudgment interest and civil penalties as follows: Weintraub was to make quarterly payments of \$43,750, commencing three months after entry of the Final Judgment, for a period of three years, and a balloon payment of \$525,000 within eighteen months of entry of the Final Judgment. Weintraub's Consent and the Final Judgment also specify that if Weintraub fails to make any single payment or any portion of any payment by the date it is due, the installment terms of the Final Judgment no longer apply, and the full amount of \$1,050,000 is immediately due, with post-judgment interest.

Weintraub's first quarterly payment was due on July 12, 2005. Weintraub did not make the payment. Thus, under terms of the Final Judgment, Weintraub now owes the full \$1,050,000 in disgorgement, prejudgment interest, and civil penalties. Accordingly,

**I.**

**DISGORGEMENT AND CIVIL PENALTY**

**IT IS ORDERED AND ADJUDGED** that Weintraub is liable for disgorgement and prejudgment interest on disgorgement totaling \$930,000, representing his ill-gotten gains as a result of the conduct alleged in the Complaint, and a civil penalty in the amount of \$120,000 pursuant to Section 20(d) of the Securities Act of 1933 ("Securities Act") [15 U.S.C. § 77t(d)], and Section 21(d) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 ("Exchange Act") [15 U.S.C. § 78u(d)(3)]. The total Amended Final Judgment against Weintraub is \$1,050,000, plus post-judgment interest calculated from the date of this Amended Final Judgment at rate of interest set forth in Rule 600(b) of the Commission's Rules of Practice, 17 C.F.R. § 201.600(b), **FOR WHICH LET EXECUTION ISSUE.**

All payments in satisfaction of the Amended Final Judgment shall be: (a) made by United States postal money order, certified check, bank cashier's check or bank money order; (b) made payable to the Securities and Exchange Commission; (c) hand-delivered or mailed to the Office of Financial Management, Securities and Exchange Commission, Operations Center, 6432 General Green Way, Alexandria, Stop 0-3, VA 22312; and (d) submitted under cover letter that identifies Allen Weintraub as a Defendant in these proceedings. A copy of the cover letter and money order or check shall be sent to Robert K. Levenson, Regional Trial Counsel, Securities and Exchange Commission, 801 Brickell Avenue, Suite 1800, Miami, Florida, 33131.

**RETENTION OF JURISDICTION**


