Final Judgment

- Lawrence H. Theriot is permanently enjoined from making use of the mails or instrumentalities of commerce in order to offer, promise, pay, or give something of value to:
 - A. Foreign officials,
 - B. Foreign political parties, their officials, or candidates, or
 - C. People who may pass items of value onto officials, parties, or candidates

In order to affect their decisions, acts, or omissions or cause them to influence a government.

- 2. This judgment applies to Theriot's agents, employees, attorneys, relatives, and others in active concert or participation with them who receive actual notice of this judgment.
- 3. Theriot may pay foreign officials or parties to expedite or secure routine governmental action.
- 4. By January 14, 2005, Theriot must pay \$11,000 to the Securities and Exchange Commission at a post-judgment interest rate of 2.71%.
- He may pay by certified check, bank cashier's check, or United States postal money order. He must send his payment to: Office of Financial Management, Securities and Exchange Commission, Operations Center, 6432 General Green Way, Mail Stop 0-3, Alexandria, Virginia 22312.
