FINAL JUDGMENT AS TO DEFENDANT ANGEL ALVAREZ-PEREZ

The Securities and Exchange Commission having filed a Complaint and Defendant Angel Alvarez-Perez ("Alvarez") having entered a general appearance; consented to the Court's jurisdiction over him and the subject matter of this action; consented to entry of this Final Judgment without admitting or denying the allegations of the Complaint (except as to jurisdiction); waived findings of fact and conclusions of law; and waived any right to appeal from this Final Judgment:

I

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, ADJUDGED, AND DECREED that Alvarez and his agents, servants, employees, attorneys, and all persons in active concert or participation with them who receive actual notice of this Final Judgment by personal service or otherwise are permanently restrained and enjoined

from violating, directly or indirectly, Section 10(b) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 (the "Exchange Act") [15 U.S.C. § 78j(b)] and Rule 10b-5 promulgated thereunder [17 C.F.R. § 240.10b-5], by using any / means or instrumentality of interstate commerce, or of the mails, or of any facility of any national securities exchange, in connection with the purchase or sale of any security:

- (a) to employ any device, scheme, or artifice to defraud;
- (b) to make any untrue statement of a material fact or to omit to state a material fact necessary in order to make the statements made, in the light of the circumstances under which they were made, not misleading; or
- (c) to engage in any act, practice, or course of business which operates or would operate as a fraud or deceit upon any person.

ΙI

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED, AND DECREED that Alvarez and his agents, servants, employees, attorneys, and all persons in active concert or participation with them who receive actual notice of this Final Judgment by personal service or otherwise are permanently restrained and enjoined from aiding and abetting any violation of Section 13(a) of

the Exchange Act [15 U.S.C. § 78m(a)] and Rules 13a-1, 13a-13 and 12b-20 thereunder [17 C.F.R. §§ 240.13a-14, 240.13a-13 and 240.12b-20] by knowingly providing substantial assistance to an issuer that files or causes to be filed with the Commission any report required to be filed with the Commission pursuant to Section 13(a) of the Exchange Act and the Exchange Act's rules and regulations that includes financial statements that are materially inaccurate.

III

that Alvarez and his agents, servants, employees, attorneys, and all persons in active concert or participation with them who receive actual notice of this Final Judgment by personal service or otherwise are permanently restrained and enjoined from aiding and abetting any violation of Section 13(b)(2)(A) of the Exchange Act [15 U.S.C. § 78m(b)(2)(A)] by knowingly providing substantial assistance to any person who, directly or indirectly, fails to make and keep books, records and accounts, which, in reasonable detail, accurately and fairly reflect the transactions and dispositions of the assets of a publicly traded company, and from violating Rule 13b2-1 of the Exchange Act [17 C.F.R. § 240.13b2-1] by, directly or indirectly, falsifying or causing the falsification of, any book, record or account

subject to Section 13(b)(2)(A) of the Exchange Act [15 U.S.C. \S 78m(b)(2)(A)].

ΙV

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED, AND DECREED that Alvarez and his agents, servants, employees, attorneys, and all persons in active concert or participation with them who receive actual notice of this Final Judgment by personal service or otherwise are permanently restrained and enjoined from violating Rule 13b2-2 of the Exchange Act [17 C.F.R. § 240.13b2-2] by, directly or indirectly, (a) making or causing to be made a materially false or misleading statement, or omitting to state, or causing another person to omit to state, any material fact necessary in order to make statements made, in light of the circumstances under which such statements were made, not misleading to an accountant, in connection with any audit or examination of the financial statements of the issuer required by the federal securities laws or the preparation or filing of any document or report required to be filed with the Commission, or (b) taking any action to coerce, manipulate, mislead, or fraudulently influence any independent public or certified public accountant engaged in the performance of an audit or review of the financial statements of that issuer that are required to be filed with the Commission which, if

successful, could result in rendering the issuer's financial statements materially misleading.

V

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED, AND DECREED that, pursuant to Section 21(d)(2) of the Exchange Act [15 U.S.C. § 78u(d)(2)] Alvarez is prohibited for five (5) years following the date of entry of this Final Judgment from acting as an officer or director of any issuer that has a class of securities registered pursuant to Section 12 of the Exchange Act [15 U.S.C. § 781] or that is required to file reports pursuant to Section 15(d) of the Exchange Act [15 U.S.C. § 78o(d)].

VI

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED, AND DECREED that Alvarez shall pay a civil penalty in the amount of \$100,000 pursuant to pursuant to Section 21(d)(3) of the Exchange Act [15 U.S.C. § 78u(d)(3)]. Defendant shall make this payment within ninety (90) business days after entry of this Final Judgment by certified check, bank cashier's check, or United States postal money order payable to the Securities and Exchange Commission. The payment shall be delivered or mailed to the Office of Financial Management, Securities and Exchange Commission, Operations Center, 6432 General Green Way, Mail Stop 0-3, Alexandria, Virginia 22312, and shall be

accompanied by a letter identifying Alvarez as a defendant in this action; setting forth the title and divil action number of this action and the name of this Court; and specifying that payment is made pursuant to this Final Judgment. Defendant shall pay post-judgment interest on any delinquent amounts pursuant to 28 USC § 1961. The Commission shall remit the funds paid pursuant to this paragraph to the United States Treasury.

VII

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED, AND DECREED that the Consent is incorporated herein with the same force and effect as if fully set forth herein, and that Defendant shall comply with all of the undertakings and agreements set forth therein.

VIII

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED, AND DECREED that this Court shall retain jurisdiction of this matter for the purposes of enforcing the terms of this Final Judgment.
