FINAL JUDGMENT AGAINST AMANDA E. KNORR

On February 22, 2012, Plaintiff U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission (“SEC”) filed a motion for entry of final judgment against Amanda E. Knorr. (Doc. # 256.) On August 30, 2012, the Court granted that Motion. (Doc. # 306.) The Court previously entered a permanent injunction against Amanda E. Knorr. (Doc. # 183.) Based on the findings contained in the Court’s Order Granting Plaintiff’s Motion for Entry of Final Judgment Against Defendant Amanda E. Knorr, and the previously entered permanent injunction, which is incorporated herein:

I.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, ADJUDGED, AND DECREED that Defendant Amanda E. Knorr is liable for disgorgement of \$37,031,035.36, jointly and severally with Mantria Corporation and Troy B. Wragg, representing profits gained as a result of the conduct alleged in the Complaint, together with prejudgment interest thereon in the

amount of \$3,713,772.06, and a civil penalty in the amount of \$37,031,035.36 pursuant to Section 20(d) of the Securities Act, 15 U.S.C. § 77t(d) and Section 21(d)(3) of the Exchange Act, 15 U.S.C. § 78u(d)(3). Defendant shall satisfy this obligation by paying \$77,775,842.78 within 14 days after entry of this Final Judgment.

Defendant may transmit payment electronically to the Commission, which will provide detailed ACH transfer/Fedwire instructions upon request. Payment may also be made directly from a bank account via Pay.gov through the SEC website at <http://www.sec.gov/about/offices/ofm.htm>. Defendant may also pay by certified check, bank cashier's check, or United States postal money order payable to the Securities and Exchange Commission, which shall be delivered or mailed to:

and shall be accompanied by a letter identifying the case title, civil action number, and name of this Court; Amanda E. Knorr as a defendant in this action; and specifying that payment is made pursuant to this Final Judgment.

Defendant shall simultaneously transmit photocopies of evidence of payment and case identifying information to the Commission's counsel in this action. By making this payment, Defendant relinquishes all legal and equitable right, title, and interest in such funds and no part of the funds shall be returned to Defendant.

The Commission may enforce the Court's judgment for disgorgement and prejudgment interest by moving for civil contempt (and/or through other collection procedures authorized by law) at any time after 14 days following entry of this Final Judgment. Defendant shall pay post judgment interest on any delinquent amounts

pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 1961. The Commission shall hold the funds, together with any interest and income earned thereon (collectively, the “Fund”), pending further order of the Court.

The Commission may propose a plan to distribute the Fund subject to the Court’s approval. Such a plan may provide that the Fund shall be distributed pursuant to the Fair Fund provisions of Section 308(a) of the Sarbanes-Oxley Act of 2002. The Court shall retain jurisdiction over the administration of any distribution of the Fund. If the Commission staff determines that the Fund will not be distributed, the Commission shall send the funds paid pursuant to this Final Judgment to the United States Treasury.

Regardless of whether any such Fair Fund distribution is made, amounts ordered to be paid as civil penalties pursuant to this Judgment shall be treated as penalties paid to the government for all purposes, including all tax purposes. To preserve the deterrent effect of the civil penalty, Defendant shall not, after offset or reduction of any award of compensatory damages in any Related Investor Action based on Defendant’s payment of disgorgement in this action, argue that she is entitled to, nor shall she further benefit by, offset or reduction of such compensatory damages award by the amount of any part of Defendant’s payment of a civil penalty in this action (“Penalty Offset”). If the court in any Related Investor Action grants such a Penalty Offset, Defendant shall, within 30 days after entry of a final order granting the Penalty Offset, notify the Commission’s counsel in this action and pay the amount of the Penalty Offset to the United States Treasury or to a Fair Fund, as the Commission directs. Such a payment shall not be deemed an additional civil penalty and shall not be deemed to change the amount of the civil penalty imposed in this Judgment. For purposes of this paragraph, a “Related Investor Action” means a private damages action brought against

Defendant by or on behalf of one or more investors based on substantially the same facts as alleged in the Complaint in this action.

Defendant shall receive credit against the disgorgement amount owed by her for moneys returned to investors by Mantria's Receiver in this action, which are the result of liquidation of properties or assets directly linked to investor funds or contributions, and for moneys recovered in connection with the Receiver's related litigation entitled, *John Paul Anderson v. Astor Weis Kaplan & Mandel LLP, et al.*, No. 12-cv-00488-RBJ (D. Colo.).

II.

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED, AND DECREED that the Court shall retain jurisdiction of this matter for all purposes.

III.

There being no just reason for delay, pursuant to Rule 54(b) of the Federal Rules of Civil Procedure, the Clerk is ordered to enter this Final Judgment forthwith and without further notice.
