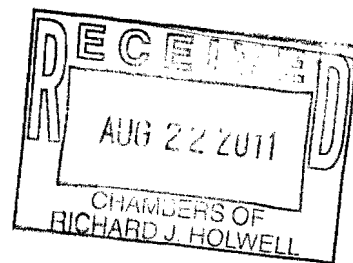

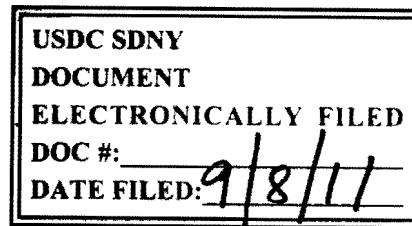

**JUDGMENT AGAINST CLX & ASSOCIATES, INC.
AND ROBERT L. WEIDENBAUM**

In accordance with the Court's Memorandum Opinion and Order dated August 11, 2011, judgment is entered on the Securities and Exchange Commission's claim that defendants Robert L. Weidenbaum ("Weidenbaum") and CLX & Associates Inc. violated Section 5 of the Securities Act of 1933, 15 U.S.C. § 77e, in their sales of the securities of Universal Express Inc. The Court finds that no factual disputes remain to be resolved, because Weidenbaum and CLX & Associates Inc. consented to entry of a permanent injunction from violating Section 5 of the Securities Act of 1933, 15 U.S.C. 77e, imposing a penny stock bar, and finding them liable for disgorgement, including prejudgment interest, and civil penalties. The Court's Memorandum Opinion and Order dated August 11, 2011 resolved all outstanding claims and issues related to Weidenbaum and CLX & Associates Inc. Although issues remain related to the SEC's claims against defendants Michael Xirinachs and Emerald Asset Advisors LLC, those issues and claims have no bearing on the SEC's claims against Weidenbaum and CLX & Associates Inc. The

violations of Section 5 by Weidenbaum and CLX & Associates Inc. are independent of the alleged violations by the other defendants, so entry of a final judgment under Fed. R. C. P. 54(b) is appropriate as there is no just reason for delay.

I.

IT IS ORDERED, ADJUDGED, AND DECREED that Defendants Weidenbaum and CLX & Associates Inc., and each of Defendant's agents, servants, employees, attorneys, and all persons in active concert or participation with them who receive actual notice of this Judgment by personal service or otherwise are permanently restrained and enjoined from violating Section 5 of the Securities Act [15 U.S.C. § 77e] by, directly or indirectly, in the absence of any applicable exemption:

- (a) Unless a registration statement is in effect as to a security, making use of any means or instruments of transportation or communication in interstate commerce or of the mails to sell such security through the use or medium of any prospectus or otherwise;
- (b) Unless a registration statement is in effect as to a security, carrying or causing to be carried through the mails or in interstate commerce, by any means or instruments of transportation, any such security for the purpose of sale or for delivery after sale; or
- (c) Making use of any means or instruments of transportation or communication in interstate commerce or of the mails to offer to sell or offer to buy through the use or medium of any prospectus or otherwise any security, unless a registration statement has been filed with the Commission as to such security, or while the registration statement is the subject of a refusal order or stop order or (prior to the

effective date of the registration statement) any public proceeding or examination under Section 8 of the Securities Act [15 U.S.C. § 77h].

II.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED, AND DECREED that Defendants Weidenbaum and CLX & Associates Inc. are permanently barred from participating in an offering of penny stock, including engaging in activities with a broker, dealer, or issuer for purposes of issuing, trading, or inducing or attempting to induce the purchase or sale of any penny stock. A penny stock is any equity security that has a price of less than five dollars, except as provided in Rule 3a51-1 under the Exchange Act [17 C.F.R. § 240.3a51-1].

III.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED, AND DECREED that Defendants Weidenbaum and CLX & Associates Inc. are liable jointly and severally for disgorgement of \$2,411,397 representing profits gained as a result of the conduct alleged in the Complaint, together with prejudgment interest thereon of \$486,344.40, and a civil penalty of \$2,411,397 pursuant to Section 20(d) of the Securities Act [15 U.S.C. § 77t(d)], for a total of \$5,309,138.40. Defendants shall satisfy this obligation by paying \$5,309,138.40 within 14 days after entry of this Judgment to the Clerk of this Court, by certified check, bank cashier's check, or United States postal money order payable to the Securities and Exchange Commission. The payment shall be delivered or mailed to the Office of Financial Management, Securities and Exchange Commission, 100 F Street, NE, Stop 6042, Washington DC 20549, and shall be accompanied by a letter identifying Elliott and Scott Elliott Inc. as defendants in this action; setting forth the title and civil action number of this action and the name of this Court; and specifying that payment is made pursuant to this Judgment. Defendant shall pay post-judgment interest on any delinquent

amounts pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 1961. The Commission shall remit the funds paid pursuant to this paragraph to the United States Treasury.

IV.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that this Court shall retain jurisdiction of this matter for purposes of enforcing the terms of this Judgment.


V.

Your attention is directed to Rule 4(a)(1) of the Federal Rules of Appellate Procedure, which requires that if you wish to appeal the judgment in your case, you must file a notice of appeal within 30 days of the date of entry of the judgment (60 days if the United States or an officer or agency of the United States is a party).

If you wish to appeal the judgment but for any reason you are unable to file your notice of appeal within the required time, you may make a motion for an extension of time in accordance with the provision of Fed. R. App. P. 4(a)(5). That rule requires you to show "excusable neglect" or "good cause" for your failure to file your notice of appeal within the time allowed. Any such motion must first be served upon the other parties and then filed with the Pro Se Office no later than 60 days from the date of entry of the judgment (90 days if the United States or an officer or agency of the United States is a party).

The enclosed Forms 1, 2 and 3 cover some common situations, and you may choose to use one of them if appropriate to your circumstances.

The Filing fee for a notice of appeal is \$5.00 and the appellate docketing fee is \$450.00 payable to the "Clerk of the Court, USDC, SDNY" by certified check, money order or cash. **No personal checks are accepted.**
