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## Item 4 Services, Fees and Compensation

### A. INVESTMENT ADVISORY SERVICES

Upon the specific request by a client, DWM may offer its services on a wrap fee basis. Under DWM's Wrap Fee Program, clients can determine to engage DWM to provide discretionary and/or non-discretionary investment advisory services on a "wrap fee basis". (*See* discussion below). If DWM offers its services on a wrap fee basis the client will pay a single fee for bundled services (i.e. investment advisory, brokerage, custody). The services included in a wrap fee agreement will depend upon each client's particular need.

### DYNASTY WEALTH MANAGEMENT, LLC WRAP PROGRAM

DWM is the sponsor and investment manager of the Dynasty Wealth Management, LLC Wrap Program (hereinafter the "Program"). Under the Program, DWM is able to offer participants discretionary and/or non-discretionary investment management services, for a single specified annual Program fee, inclusive of trade execution, custody, reporting, and investment management fees. The current annual Program fee ranges from negotiable to 2%, depending upon the amount and type of the Program assets.

Under the Program, for those clients that engage DWM on the discretionary basis, DWM shall be provided with written authority to determine which securities and the amounts of securities that are bought or sold. Any limitations on this discretionary authority shall be included in the written agreement between each client and DWM. Clients may change/amend these limitations, in writing, at any time. The client shall have reasonable access to one of DWM's investment professionals to discuss their account.

DWM generally recommends that Fidelity Investments ("*Fidelity*") or Charles Schwab & Co. ("*Schwab*") shall serve as the custodian for Program accounts.

**Fee Differentials:** In certain circumstances, DWM, in its sole discretion, may charge a different wrap fee (higher or lower) based upon certain criteria (i.e., complexity of the engagement, anticipated future earning capacity, anticipated future additional assets, dollar amount of assets to be managed, related accounts, account composition, anticipated level and scope of other services to be provided (i.e. financial planning services), negotiations with client etc.).

**Please Note: Non-Discretionary Service Limitations:** Clients that determine to engage DWM on a non-discretionary investment advisory basis **must be willing to accept** that the Registrant cannot effect any account transactions without obtaining prior verbal consent to any such transaction(s) from the client. Thus, in the event of a market correction during which the client is unavailable,

DWM will be unable to effect any account transactions (as it would for its discretionary clients) without first obtaining the client's verbal consent.

**Fee Calculation:** The fee charged is calculated as described above and is not charged on the basis of a share of capital gains upon or capital appreciation of the funds or any portion of the funds of an advisory client, pursuant to Section 205(a)(1) of the Investment Advisers Act of 1940, as amended (hereinafter the "Advisers Act").

**Fee Payment:** Clients will be charged in advance at the beginning of each calendar quarter based upon the average daily of the client's account for the previous quarter. Such amount will be adjusted at the end of the quarter based on the average daily balance for the prior quarter. In some cases this may result in a debit or a credit to fees charged at the beginning of each calendar quarter. Fees are prorated for accounts opened during the quarter. An additional fee for the current quarter will be assessed if assets are deposited after the beginning of the quarter, prorated based on the number of calendar days remaining in the quarter during which the service will be in effect. No portion of the fee will be credited to the client for the current calendar quarter should any withdrawals from the portfolio occur in the same calendar quarter.

**Termination of Advisory Relationship:** A client agreement may be canceled at any time, by either party, for any reason upon receipt of prior written notice. Upon termination of any account, any prepaid, unearned fees will be promptly refunded, and any earned, unpaid fees will be due and payable. The client has the right to terminate an agreement without penalty within five (5) business days after entering into the agreement.

## **MISCELLANEOUS**

**Client Responsibilities:** In performing any of its services, DWM shall not be required to verify any information received from the client or from the client's other professionals, and is expressly authorized to rely thereon. Furthermore, unless the client indicates to the contrary in the client's Investment Objective Confirmation letter, DWM shall assume that there are no restrictions on its services, other than to manage the account in accordance with the client's designated investment objective and its obligations as a registered investment advisor. **Moreover, it remains each client's responsibility to promptly notify DWM if there is ever any change in his/her/its financial situation or investment objectives for the purpose of reviewing/evaluating/revising DWM's previous recommendations and/or services.**

**Please Note: Investment Performance:** As a condition to participating in the Program, the participant **must** accept that past performance may not be indicative of future results, and understand that the future performance of any specific investment or investment strategy (**including** the investments and/or investment strategies purchased and/or undertaken by DWM) **may not:** (1) achieve

their intended objective; (2) be profitable; or, (3) equal historical performance level(s) or any other performance level(s).

- B. Participation in the Program may cost more or less than purchasing such services separately. Also the Program fee charged by Registrant for participation in the Program may be higher or lower than those charged by other sponsors of comparable wrap fee programs.

Depending upon the percentage wrap-fee charged by DWM, the amount of portfolio activity in the client's account, and the value of custodial and other services provided, the wrap fee may or may not exceed the aggregate cost of such services if they were to be provided separately and/or if DWM were to negotiate transaction fees and seek best price and execution of transactions for the client's account.

- C. The Program's wrap fee does not include certain charges and administrative fees, including, but not limited to, fees charged by *Independent Managers*, transaction charges (including mark-ups and mark-downs) resulting from trades effected through or with a broker-dealer other than *Fidelity* or *Schwab*, transfer taxes, odd lot differentials, exchange fees, interest charges, American Depository Receipt agency processing fees, and any charges, taxes or other fees mandated by any federal, state or other applicable law or otherwise agreed to with regard to client accounts. Such fees and expenses are in addition to the Program's wrap fee.
- D. DWM's related persons who recommend the Dynasty Wealth Management Wrap Program to clients do not receive compensation as a result of a client's participation in the wrap fee program.

## **Item 5            Account Requirements and Types of Clients**

DWM's clients shall generally include individuals, pension and profit sharing plans, trusts, estates and charitable organizations, and business entities. DWM's annual investment advisory fee shall be prorated and paid quarterly, in advance, based upon the average daily balance of the assets under management of the previous quarter. DWM generally requires a minimum asset level of \$5,000,000 for investment advisory services. DWM, in its sole discretion, may reduce or waive its minimum asset requirement based upon certain criteria (i.e. anticipated future earning capacity, anticipated future additional assets, dollar amount of assets to be managed, related accounts, account composition, negotiations with client, etc.).

## **Item 6            Portfolio Manager Selection and Evaluation**

- A. DWM may allocate a portion of a client's Program assets among unaffiliated independent investment managers in accordance with the client's

designated investment objective(s). In such situations, the *Independent Manager[s]* shall have day-to-day responsibility for the active discretionary management of the allocated Program assets. DWM shall continue to render investment supervisory services to the client relative to the ongoing monitoring and review of account performance, asset allocation and client investment objectives. Factors which DWM shall consider in recommending *Independent Manager[s]* include the client's designated investment objective(s), management style, performance, reputation, financial strength, reporting, pricing, and research.

- B. DWM acts as the portfolio manager for the Program. Inasmuch as the execution costs for transactions effected in the client account will be paid by DWM, a potential conflict of interest arises in that DWM may have a disincentive to trade securities in the client account. In addition, the amount of compensation received by DWM as a result of the client's participation in the Program may be more than what DWM would receive if the client paid separately for investment advice, brokerage and other services.

As the Program sponsor, DWM shall be responsible for the primary management of the Program, including the selection and termination of all *Independent Manager[s]*. Once selected, *Independent Manager[s]* shall be responsible for day-to-day management and selection of securities for the account.

- C. As discussed below, DWM also offers to its clients discretionary and non-discretionary investment advisory services on a non-wrap fee basis. Also, to the extent specifically requested by a client, DWM offers financial planning and related consulting services.

## **ADVISORY BUSINESS SERVICES**

### **Investment Advisory Services**

The client can determine to engage DWM to provide discretionary and/or non-discretionary investment advisory services on a *fee* basis. On the specific request by a client, DWM may offer its services on a wrap fee basis. (*See* discussion below). If DWM offers its services on a wrap fee basis the client will pay a single fee for bundled services (i.e. investment advisory, brokerage, custody). The services included in a wrap fee agreement will depend upon each client's particular need. Clients may also be offered investment advisory services on a non-wrap fee basis and the client will select individual services on an unbundled basis, paying for each service separately (i.e. investment advisory, brokerage, custody).

### **Non-Wrap Fee Basis**

The client can determine to engage DWM to provide discretionary and/or non-discretionary investment advisory services on a *fee* basis. DWM shall charge a fixed annual investment management fee generally between negotiable and 1.5%. This annual investment advisory fee is based upon various objective and subjective factors, including, but not limited to, the amount of the assets placed under DWM's management, the type of management services to be rendered, the complexity of the engagement, and the level and scope of the overall investment advisory services to be rendered. (See also Fee Differentials below).

### **Dynasty Wealth Management, LLC Wrap Program**

Upon the specific request by a client, DWM may offer its services on a wrap fee basis. Clients who are provided investment advisory services on a wrap fee basis shall receive services in accordance with DWM's investment management wrap fee program (the "Program"). Under the Program, DWM is able to offer participants discretionary and/or non-discretionary investment management services, for a single specified annual Program fee, inclusive of trade execution, custody, reporting, and investment management fees. The current annual Program fee ranges from negotiable to 2%, depending upon the amount and type of the Program assets. DWM generally recommends that *Fidelity* or *Schwab* serve as the custodian for Program accounts.

### **Financial Planning and Consulting Services**

To the extent requested by a client, DWM *may* determine to provide financial planning and/or consulting services (including investment and non-investment related matters, including estate planning, insurance planning, etc.) on a stand-alone fee basis. DWM's planning and consulting fees are negotiable, but generally range from \$250 to \$25,000 on a fixed fee basis, and from \$100 to \$1,000 on an hourly rate basis, depending upon the level and scope of the service(s) required and the professional(s) rendering the service(s). Prior to engaging DWM to provide planning or consulting services, clients are generally required to enter into a *Financial Planning and Consulting Agreement* with Registrant setting forth the terms and conditions of the engagement (including termination), describing the scope of the services to be provided, and the portion of the fee that is due from the client prior to Registrant commencing services. If requested by the client, Registrant may recommend the services of other professionals for implementation purposes, including certain of DWM's representatives in their individual capacities as registered representatives of a broker-dealer and/or licensed insurance agents. (*See* disclosure below). The client is under no obligation to engage the services of any such recommended professional. The client retains absolute discretion over all such implementation decisions and is free to accept or reject any recommendation from DWM. **Please Note:** If the client engages any such recommended professional, and a dispute arises thereafter relative to such engagement, the client agrees to seek recourse exclusively from and against the engaged professional.



**Please Also Note:** It remains the client's responsibility to promptly notify DWM if there is ever any change in his/her/its financial situation or investment objectives for the purpose of reviewing/evaluating/revising DWM's previous recommendations and/or services.

### **Miscellaneous Advisory Services Disclosure**

**Non-Investment Consulting/Implementation Services:** If requested by the client, DWM may provide consulting services regarding non-investment related matters, such as estate planning, tax planning, insurance, etc. Neither DWM, nor any of its representatives, serves as an attorney or accountant, and no portion of DWM's services should be construed as same. To the extent requested by a client, DWM may recommend the services of other professionals for certain non-investment implementation purposes (i.e. attorneys, accountants, insurance, etc.), including representatives of DWM in their separate registered and/or licensed capacities as discussed below. The client is under no obligation to engage the services of any such recommended professional. The client retains absolute discretion over all such implementation decisions and is free to accept or reject any recommendation from DWM. **Please Note:** If the client engages any such recommended professional, and a dispute arises thereafter relative to such engagement, the client agrees to seek recourse exclusively from and against the engaged professional. It remains the client's responsibility to promptly notify DWM if there is ever any change in his/her/its financial situation or investment objectives for the purpose of reviewing/evaluating/revising DWM's previous recommendations and/or services.

**Inverse/Enhanced Market Strategies:** DWM may utilize long and short mutual funds and/or exchange traded funds that are designed to perform in either an: (1) inverse relationship to certain market indices (at a rate of 1 or more times the inverse [opposite] result of the corresponding index) as an investment strategy and/or for the purpose of hedging against downside market risk; and (2) enhanced relationship to certain market indices (at a rate of 1 or more times the actual result of the corresponding index) as an investment strategy and/or for the purpose of increasing gains in an advancing market. There can be **no assurance** that any such strategy will prove profitable or successful. In light of these enhanced risks/rewards, a client may direct DWM, in writing, not to employ any or all such strategies for his/her/their/its accounts.

**Affiliated Commodity Pool Operator and Commodity Trading Advisor.** Dynasty Fund Services, LLC ("DFS"), an affiliate of Dynasty and a wholly-owned subsidiary of the Parent, is registered as a commodity pool operator and a commodity trading advisor with the Commodity Futures Trading Commission and is a member of the National Futures Association.

**Private Fund.** Dynasty Funds Services, LLC serves as an investment adviser to a “Private Fund” which is an unregistered investment company organized as a limited liability company.

In providing advisory services to the Private Fund, Dynasty directs and manages the investment and reinvestment of the Private Fund’s assets and provides reports to investors (through the Private Funds’ administrator). Dynasty manages the assets of the Private Fund in accordance with the terms of the governing documents.

**Risks:** Private investment funds generally involve various risk factors, including, but not limited to, potential for complete loss of principal, liquidity constraints and lack of transparency, a complete discussion of which is set forth in each fund’s offering documents, which will be provided to each client for review and consideration. Unlike other liquid investments that a client may maintain, private investment funds do not provide daily liquidity or pricing. Each prospective client investor will be required to complete a Subscription Agreement, pursuant to which the client shall establish that he/she is qualified for investment in the fund, and acknowledges and accepts the various risk factors that are associated with such an investment.

**Conflict Of Interest:** Because DWM earns compensation from the *affiliated private fund*, DWM’s advisory fee may, indirectly, exceed the fee that DWM would earn under its standard “assets under management” fee schedule. The recommendation that a client become an investor in the *affiliated private fund* could present a **conflict of interest**. No client is under any obligation to become an investor in the *affiliated private fund*. DWM’s Chief Compliance Officer, Jeffrey A. Lang, remains available to address any questions regarding this conflict of interest.

**Valuation:** In the event that DWM references private investment funds owned by the client on any supplemental account reports prepared by DWM, the value(s) for all such private investment funds shall reflect either the initial purchase and/or the most recent valuation provided by the fund sponsor. If the valuation reflects the initial purchase price (and/or a value as of a previous date), the current value(s) (to the extent ascertainable) could be **significantly more or less** than the original purchase price.

**Fee Differentials:** As indicated above, DWM shall price its services based upon various objective and subjective factors. As a result, DWM's clients could pay diverse fees based upon the market value of their assets, the complexity of the engagement, and the level and scope of the overall investment advisory and/or consulting services to be rendered. As a result of these factors, the services to be provided by DWM to any particular client could be available from other advisers at lower fees. All clients and prospective clients should be guided accordingly.

**Administrative Support Services:** DWM also provides back-office and administrative support services to unaffiliated registered investment advisers that are typically independent. Registrant is not involved in the client investment management and/or suitability processes relative to such unaffiliated advisers, such responsibilities remaining exclusively with the unaffiliated investment advisers.

**Sub-Advisory Services:** The Firm may provide investment sub-advisory services to unaffiliated investment advisers.

**Independent Managers:** DWM may allocate (and/or recommend that the client allocate) a portion of a client's investment assets among unaffiliated independent investment managers in accordance with the client's designated investment objective(s). In such situations, the *Independent Manager[s]* shall have day-to-day responsibility for the active discretionary management of the allocated assets. DWM shall continue to render investment advisory services to the client relative to the ongoing monitoring and review of account performance, asset allocation and client investment objectives. Factors which DWM shall consider in recommending *Independent Manager[s]* include the client's designated investment objective(s), management style, performance, reputation, financial strength, reporting, pricing, and research.

**Non-Discretionary Service Limitations:** Clients that determine to engage DWM on a non-discretionary investment advisory basis **must be willing to accept** that the Registrant cannot effect any account transactions without obtaining prior verbal consent to any such transaction(s) from the client. Thus, in the event of a market correction during which the client is unavailable, DWM will be unable to effect any account transactions (as it would for its discretionary clients) without first obtaining the client's verbal consent.

**Client Obligations:** In performing its services, Registrant shall not be required to verify any information received from the client or from the client's other professionals, and is expressly authorized to rely thereon. Moreover, each client is advised that it remains his/her/its responsibility to promptly notify DWM if there is ever any change in his/her/its financial situation or investment objectives for the purpose of reviewing/evaluating/revising DWM's previous recommendations and/or services.

**Disclosure Statement.** A copy of DWM's written Brochure as set forth on Part 2A of Form ADV shall be provided to each client prior to, or contemporaneously with, the execution of the *Investment Advisory Agreement or Financial Planning and Consulting Agreement*.

DWM shall provide investment advisory services specific to needs of each client. Prior to providing investment advisory services, an investment adviser representative will discuss with each client, their particular investment objective(s). DWM shall allocate each client's investment assets consistent with their designated investment objective(s). Clients may, at anytime, impose restrictions, in writing, on DWM's services.

DWM primarily offers its investment advisory services on a non-wrap fee basis. However, upon the specific request of a client, DWM may offer its services on a wrap fee basis. There is no significant difference between how DWM manages wrap fee accounts and non-wrap fee accounts. However, as stated above, if DWM determines to make its investment advisory services available to a client on a wrap fee basis, the client will pay a single fee for bundled services (i.e. investment advisory, brokerage, custody) (***See*** Item 4.B). The services included in a wrap fee agreement will depend upon each client's particular need. The majority of DWM's clients shall be provided investment advisory services on a non-wrap fee basis and the client will select individual services on an unbundled basis, paying for each service separately (i.e. investment advisory, brokerage, custody). **Please Note:** When managing a client's account on a wrap fee basis, DWM shall receive as payment for its investment advisory services, the balance of the wrap fee after all other costs incorporated into the wrap fee have been deducted.

#### **Performance Based Fees and Side-By-Side Management**

Neither DWM nor any supervised person of DWM accepts performance-based fees.

#### **Methods of Analysis, Investment Strategies and Risk of Loss**

DWM may utilize the following methods of security analysis:

- ☐ Charting - (analysis performed using patterns to identify current trends and trend reversals to forecast the direction of prices)
- ☐ Fundamental - (analysis performed on historical and present data, with the goal of making financial forecasts)
- ☐ Technical - (analysis performed on historical and present data, focusing on price and trade volume, to forecast the direction of prices)

DWM may utilize the following investment strategies when implementing investment advice given to clients:

- ☐ Long Term Purchases (securities held at least a year)
- ☐ Short Term Purchases (securities sold within a year)
- ☐ Trading (securities sold within thirty (30) days)

- Short Sales (contracted sale of borrowed securities with an obligation to make the lender whole)
- Margin Transactions (use of borrowed assets to purchase financial instruments)
- Options (contract for the purchase or sale of a security at a predetermined price during a specific period of time)

**Investment Risk:** Different types of investments involve varying degrees of risk, and it should not be assumed that future performance of any specific investment or investment strategy (including the investments and/or investment strategies recommended or undertaken by DWM) will be profitable or equal any specific performance level(s).

DWM's methods of analysis and investment strategies do not present any significant or unusual risks.

Every method of analysis has its own inherent risks. To perform an accurate market analysis DWM must have access to current/new market information. DWM has no control over the dissemination rate of market information; therefore, unbeknownst to DWM, certain analyses may be compiled with outdated market information, severely limiting the value of DWM's analysis. Furthermore, an accurate market analysis can only produce a forecast of the direction of market values. There can be no assurances that a forecasted change in market value will materialize into actionable and/or profitable investment opportunities.

DWM's primary investment strategies - Long Term Purchases, Short Term Purchases, and Trading - are fundamental investment strategies. However, every investment strategy has its own inherent risks and limitations. For example longer term investment strategies require a longer investment time period to allow for the strategy to potentially develop. Shorter term investment strategies require a shorter investment time period to potentially develop but, as a result of more frequent trading, may incur higher transactional costs when compared to a longer term investment strategy. Trading, an investment strategy that requires the purchase and sale of securities within a thirty (30) day investment time period, involves a very short investment time period but will incur higher transaction costs when compared to a short term investment strategy and substantially higher transaction costs than a longer term investment strategy.

In addition to the fundamental investment strategies discussed above, DWM may also implement and/or recommend – short selling, use of margin, and/or options transactions. Each of these strategies has a high level of inherent risk. (See discussion below).

Short selling is an investment strategy with a high level of inherent risk. Short selling, involves the selling of assets that the investor does not own. The investor

borrowes the assets from a third party lender (i.e. Broker-Dealer) with the obligation of buying identical assets at a later date to return to the third party lender. Individuals who engage in this activity shall only profit from a decline in the price of the assets between the original date of sale and the date of repurchase. Conversely, the short seller will incur a loss if the price of the assets rises. Other costs of shorting may include a fee for borrowing the assets and payment of any dividends paid on the borrowed assets.

Margin is an investment strategy with a high level of inherent risk. A margin transaction occurs when an investor uses borrowed assets to purchase financial instruments. The investor generally obtains the borrowed assets by using other securities as collateral for the borrowed sum. The effect of purchasing a security using margin is to magnify any gains or losses sustained by the purchase of the financial instruments on margin. **Please Note:** To the extent that a client authorizes the use of margin, and margin is thereafter employed by DWM in the management of the client's investment portfolio, the market value of the client's account and corresponding fee payable by the client to DWM may be increased. As a result, in addition to understanding and assuming the additional principal risks associated with the use of margin, clients authorizing margin are advised of the potential ***conflict of interest*** whereby the client's decision to employ margin *may* correspondingly increase the management fee payable to DWM. Accordingly, the decision as to whether to employ margin is left totally to the discretion of client.

The use of options transactions as an investment strategy involves a high level of inherent risk. Option transactions establish a contract between two parties concerning the buying or selling of an asset at a predetermined price during a specific period of time. During the term of the option contract, the buyer of the option gains the right to demand fulfillment by the seller. Fulfillment may take the form of either selling or purchasing a security depending upon the nature of the option contract. Generally, the purchase or the recommendation to purchase an option contract by DWM shall be with the intent of offsetting/"hedging" a potential market risk in a client's portfolio. **Please Note:** Although the intent of the options-related transactions that may be implemented by DWM is to hedge against principal risk, certain of the options-related strategies (i.e. straddles, short positions, etc), may, in and of themselves, produce principal volatility and/or risk. Thus, a client must be willing to accept these enhanced volatility and principal risks associated with such strategies. In light of these enhanced risks, client may direct the Registrant, in writing, not to employ any or all such strategies for his/her/their/its accounts.

Currently, DWM primarily allocates client investment assets among various individual equity (stocks), debt (bonds) and fixed income securities, mutual funds and/or exchange traded funds ("ETFs") (including inverse ETFs and/or mutual funds that are designed to perform in an inverse relationship to certain market indices), independent managers and private investments on a

discretionary and non-discretionary basis in accordance with the client's designated investment objective(s).

As disclosed above, DWM may utilize long and short mutual funds and/or exchange traded funds that are designed to perform in either an: (1) inverse relationship to certain market indices (at a rate of 1 or more times the inverse [opposite] result of the corresponding index) as an investment strategy and/or for the purpose of hedging against downside market risk; and (2) enhanced relationship to certain market indices (at a rate of 1 or more times the actual result of the corresponding index) as an investment strategy and/or for the purpose of increasing gains in an advancing market. There can be **no assurance** that any such strategy will prove profitable or successful. In light of these enhanced risks/rewards, a client may direct DWM, in writing, not to employ any or all such strategies for his/her/their/its accounts. (*See* Item 4 B).

**Independent Managers.** DWM may allocate (and/or recommend that the client allocate) a portion of a client's investment assets among unaffiliated independent investment managers in accordance with the client's designated investment objective(s). In such situations, the *Independent Manager[s]* shall have day-to-day responsibility for the active discretionary management of the allocated assets. DWM shall continue to render investment advisory services to the client relative to the ongoing monitoring and review of account performance, asset allocation and client investment objectives. Factors which DWM shall consider in recommending *Independent Manager[s]* include the client's designated investment objective(s), management style, performance, reputation, financial strength, reporting, pricing, and research.

### **Voting Client Securities**

DWM does not vote client proxies. Clients maintain exclusive responsibility for: (1) directing the manner in which proxies solicited by issuers of securities beneficially owned by the client shall be voted, and (2) making all elections relative to any mergers, acquisitions, tender offers, bankruptcy proceedings or other type events pertaining to the client's investment assets.

Clients will receive their proxies or other solicitations directly from their custodian. Clients may contact DWM to discuss any questions they may have with a particular solicitation.

**Item 7            Client Information Provided to Portfolio Managers**

DWM shall be the Program's portfolio manager. DWM shall provide investment advisory services specific to needs of each client. Prior to providing investment advisory services, an investment adviser representative will discuss with each client, their particular investment objective(s). DWM shall allocate each client's investment assets consistent with their designated investment objective(s). Clients may, at anytime, impose restrictions, in writing, on DWM's services.

As indicated above, each client is advised that it remains his/her/its responsibility to promptly notify DWM if there is ever any change in his/her/its financial situation or investment objectives for the purpose of reviewing/evaluating/revising DWM's previous recommendations and/or services.

To the extent the Program utilizes *Independent Manager[s]*, DWM shall provide the *Independent Manager[s]* with each client's particular investment objective(s). Any changes in the client's financial situation or investment objectives reported by the client to DWM shall be communicated to the *Independent Manager[s]* within a reasonable period of time.

**Item 8            Client Contact with Portfolio Managers**

The client shall have, without restriction, reasonable access to the Program's portfolio manager.

**Item 9            Additional Information**

- A. DWM has not been the subject of any disciplinary actions.

**Other Financial Industry Activities and Affiliations**

**Registered Representatives of PKS.** Certain of DWM's representatives are also registered representatives of Purshe Kaplan Sterling ("PKS"), an SEC registered and FINRA member broker-dealer.

Neither DWM, nor its representatives, are registered or have an application pending to register, as a futures commission merchant, commodity pool operator, a commodity trading advisor, or a representative of the foregoing.

**Broker-Dealer.** As disclosed above, certain of DWM's representatives are registered representatives of PKS, an SEC registered and FINRA member broker-



dealer. Clients can choose to engage certain of DWM's representatives, in their individual capacities, to effect securities brokerage transactions on a commission basis.

**Conflict of Interest:** The recommendation by DWM's representatives, that a client purchase a securities commission product presents a ***conflict of interest***, as the receipt of commissions may provide an incentive to recommend investment products based on commissions to be received, rather than on a particular client's need. No client is under any obligation to purchase any commission products from DWM's representatives.

**Affiliated Insurance Agency and Agents.** DWM is affiliated with Dynasty Insurance Services, a licensed insurance agency. In addition, certain of DWM's representatives, in their individual capacities, are licensed insurance agents and may recommend the purchase of certain insurance-related products on a commission basis. As referenced above, clients can engage certain of DWM's representatives to effect insurance transactions on a commission basis.

**Conflict of Interest:** The recommendation by DWM's representatives that a client purchase an insurance commission product presents a ***conflict of interest***, as the receipt of commissions may provide an incentive to recommend insurance products based on commissions received, rather than on a particular client's need. No client is under any obligation to purchase any insurance products from DWM's representatives. Clients are reminded that they may purchase insurance products recommended by Registrant through other, non-affiliated insurance agencies and/or agents.

**Affiliated Broker-Dealer.** Dynasty's affiliate, PPS Securities LLC, a wholly-owned subsidiary of the Parent, is registered as a limited use broker-dealer with FINRA.

**Affiliated Commodity Pool Operator and Commodity Trading Advisor.** Dynasty Fund Services, LLC, an affiliate of Dynasty and a wholly-owned subsidiary of the Parent, is registered as a commodity pool operator and a commodity trading advisor with the Commodity Futures Trading Commission and is a member of the National Futures Association.

DWM does not receive, directly or indirectly, compensation from investment advisors that it recommends or selects for its clients.

**B. Code of Ethics, Participation or Interest in Client Transactions and Personal Trading**

DWM maintains an investment policy relative to personal securities transactions. This investment policy is part of DWM's overall Code of Ethics, which serves to establish a standard of business conduct for all of DWM's representatives that is based upon fundamental principles of openness, integrity, honesty and trust, a copy of which is available upon request.

In accordance with Section 204A of the Advisers Act, DWM also maintains and enforces written policies reasonably designed to prevent the misuse of material non-public information by DWM or any person associated with DWM.

As disclosed above, DWM has a financial interest in the *affiliated private fund*. DWM, on a non-discretionary basis, may recommend that qualified clients consider allocating a portion of their investment assets to the *affiliated private fund*. The terms and conditions for participation in the *affiliated private fund*, including management and incentive fees, conflicts of interest, and risk factors, are set forth in the fund's offering documents. DWM's clients are under absolutely no obligation to consider or make an investment in a private investment fund(s).

DWM and/or representatives of DWM *may* buy or sell securities that are also recommended to clients. This practice may create a situation where DWM and/or representatives of DWM are in a position to materially benefit from the sale or purchase of those securities. Therefore, this situation creates a potential conflict of interest. Practices such as "scalping" (i.e., a practice whereby the owner of shares of a security recommends that security for investment and then immediately sells it at a profit upon the rise in the market price which follows the recommendation) could take place if DWM did not have adequate policies in place to detect such activities. In addition, this requirement can help detect insider trading, "front-running" (i.e., personal trades executed prior to those of DWM's clients) and other potentially abusive practices.

DWM has a personal securities transaction policy in place to monitor the personal securities transactions and securities holdings of each of DWM's "Access Persons". DWM's securities transaction policy requires that an Access Person of DWM must provide the Chief Compliance Officer or his/her designee with a written report of their current securities holdings within ten (10) days after becoming an Access Person. Additionally, each Access Person must provide the Chief Compliance Officer or his/her designee with a written report of the Access Person's current securities holdings at least once each twelve (12) month period thereafter on a date DWM selects; provided, however

that at any time that DWM has only one Access Person, he or she shall not be required to submit any securities report described above.

DWM and/or representatives of DWM *may* buy or sell securities, at or around the same time as those securities are recommended to clients. This practice creates a situation where DWM and/or representatives of DWM are in a position to materially benefit from the sale or purchase of those securities. Therefore, this situation creates a potential conflict of interest. As indicated above, DWM has a personal securities transaction policy in place to monitor the personal securities transaction and securities holdings of each of DWM's Access Persons.

### **Review of Accounts**

For those clients to whom DWM provides investment supervisory services, account reviews are conducted on an ongoing basis by DWM's Principals and/or representatives. All investment supervisory clients are advised that it remains their responsibility to advise DWM of any changes in their investment objectives and/or financial situation. All clients (in person or via telephone) are encouraged to review financial planning issues (to the extent applicable), investment objectives and account performance with DWM on an annual basis.

DWM *may* conduct account reviews on an other than periodic basis upon the occurrence of a triggering event, such as a change in client investment objectives and/or financial situation, market corrections and client request.

Clients are provided, at least quarterly, with written transaction confirmation notices and regular written summary account statements directly from the broker-dealer/custodian and/or program sponsor for the client accounts. DWM may also provide a written periodic report summarizing account activity and performance.

### **Client Referrals and Other Compensation**

DWM may receive an indirect economic benefit from *Schwab, Fidelity, Pershing, LLC ("Pershing"), J.P. Morgan, Deutsche Bank* and/or *TD Ameritrade ("TD")*. DWM, without cost (and/or at a discount), may receive support services and/or products from *Schwab, Fidelity, Pershing, J.P. Morgan, Deutsche Bank* and/or *TD*.

DWM's clients do not pay more for investment transactions effected and/or assets maintained at *Schwab, Fidelity, Pershing, J.P. Morgan, Deutsche Bank* and/or *TD* as a result of this arrangement. There is no corresponding commitment made by DWM to *Schwab, Fidelity, Pershing, J.P. Morgan, Deutsche Bank* and/or *TD* or any other entity to invest any specific amount or percentage of

client assets in any specific mutual funds, securities or other investment products as a result of the above arrangement.

If a client is introduced to DWM by either an unaffiliated or an affiliated solicitor, Registrant *may* pay that solicitor a referral fee in accordance with the requirements of Rule 206(4)-3 of the Advisers Act, and any corresponding state securities law requirements. Any such referral fee shall be paid solely from DWM's investment management fee, and shall not result in any additional charge to the client. If the client is introduced to DWM by an unaffiliated solicitor, the solicitor, at the time of the solicitation, shall disclose the nature of his/her/its solicitor relationship, and shall provide each prospective client with a copy of DWM's written Brochure with a copy of the written disclosure statement from the solicitor to the client disclosing the terms of the solicitation arrangement between DWM and the solicitor, including the compensation to be received by the solicitor from DWM.

### **Financial Information**

DWM does not solicit fees of more than \$1,200, per client, six months or more in advance.

DWM is unaware of any financial condition that is reasonably likely to impair its ability to meet its contractual commitments relating to its discretionary authority over certain client accounts.

DWM has not been the subject of a bankruptcy petition.
