ORDER TO SHOW CAUSE AND SCHEDULE PREHEARING CONFERENCE

On November 19, 2013, the Securities and Exchange Commission (Commission) issued an Order Instituting Administrative Proceedings (OIP) pursuant to Section 12(j) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 (Exchange Act). The OIP alleges that HouseRaising, Inc., iElement Corporation, InforMedix Holdings, Inc., Nortia Capital Partners, Inc., and PC Universe, Inc. (collectively, Respondents), have securities registered with the Commission pursuant to Section 12(g) of the Exchange Act and are delinquent in their periodic filings, in violation of Section 13(a) of the Exchange Act and Exchange Act Rules 13a-1 and 13a-13.

The Office of the Secretary and the Division of Enforcement have provided evidence that Respondents were served with the OIP, in accordance with Rule 141(a)(2)(ii) of the Commission's Rules of Practice, by November 20, 2013. See 17 C.F.R. § 201.141(a)(2)(ii). Respondents' Answers were due within ten days of service of the OIP, or by December 3, 2013. OIP at 3; 17 C.F.R. §§ 201.160(b), .220(b). As of today, no Answers have been filed.

Accordingly, it is ORDERED that, on or before December 13, 2013, Respondents shall show cause why the registration of their securities should not be revoked by default. See 17 C.F.R. §§ 201.155(a)(2), .220(f). Any Respondent that fails to respond shall be deemed in default and the proceeding will be determined against it. See 17 C.F.R. § 201.155(a).

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the hearing scheduled for December 9, 2013, is postponed <u>sine die</u> and a telephonic prehearing conference shall be held on December 20, 2013, at 10:00 a.m. EST, if the proceeding has not already been resolved.
