ORDER FOLLOWING SECOND PREHEARING CONFERENCE

CHINA CABLECOM HOLDINGS LTD. (n/k/a CHINA CABLECOM LTD.)

The Securities and Exchange Commission (Commission) issued an Order Instituting Proceedings (OIP) on September 5, 2013, alleging that China Cablecom Holdings Ltd. (n/k/a China Cablecom Ltd.) (China Cablecom) has securities registered with the Commission and has not filed reports required by Section 13(a) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 (Exchange Act) and Exchange Act Rule 13a-1. The OIP alleged specifically that China Cablecom had not made any periodic filings since it filed a Form 20-F for the period ended December 31, 2010. China Cablecom was served with the OIP on September 10, 2013, and filed an Answer on October 7, 2013. See 17 C.F.R. § 201.141(a)(2)(iv). Prehearing conferences were held on October 7 and December 6, 2013. An Initial Decision is due no later than January 8, 2014.

Following issuance of the OIP, on October 2 and December 5, 2013, China Cablecom filed Forms 20-F for the periods ended December 31, 2011, and December 31, 2012, respectively. At the December 6, 2013 prehearing conference, the Division of Enforcement (Division) argued that the registration of China Cablecom's registered securities should be revoked despite the recent filings, citing Commission precedent, including Nature's Sunshine Products, Inc., Exchange Act Release No. 59268 (Jan. 21, 2009), 95 SEC Docket 13488. China Cablecom acknowledged the precedent referred to by the Division, but insisted that its factual situation is unique.

I ORDERED that: the Division file a motion for summary disposition by December 13, 2013; China Cablecom file an opposition by December 20, 2013; and the Division file a reply by December 27, 2013. 17 C.F.R. §§ 201.154, .250. See AMS Homecare, Inc., Exchange Act Release No. 68506 (Dec. 20, 2012), 105 SEC Docket 62179.
