ORDER FOLLOWING PREHEARING CONFERENCE

JULIEANN PALMER MARTIN

On November 13, 2013, the Securities and Exchange Commission (Commission) issued an Order Instituting Administrative and Cease-and-Desist Proceedings (OIP) against Julieann Palmer Martin (Martin). Martin was served with the OIP on December 6, 2013, and filed an Answer on December 27, 2013. I stayed the proceeding on March 7, 2014, based on a representation by the parties that they had reached an agreement in principle to a settlement on all major terms. Julieann Palmer Martin, Admin. Proc. Rulings Release No. 1290, 2014 SEC LEXIS 848.

I held a prehearing conference on May 30, 2014, when I learned that settlement negotiations were unsuccessful. At the prehearing conference, I stated that I would rule as soon as I could on the Division of Enforcement's (Division) pending motion to compel Martin to testify, and I ordered a hearing beginning on August 25, 2014, in a courthouse to be designated for which the following schedule is applicable. The Division previously provided Martin with its list of twelve witnesses, exhibit list, and supplemental exhibit list, and filed its prehearing brief.

July 21, 2014: The Division will notify Martin of any change in its witnesses and exhibits

it intends to present as part of its direct case and provide copies of exhibits

that Martin does not have;

Aug. 4, 2014: Martin shall provide the Division with a list of her witnesses and exhibits

she intends to present as part of her direct case and copies of exhibits that

the Division does not have;

Aug. 8, 2014: Martin shall file her prehearing brief with the Commission; and

Aug. 25, 2014: Hearing beginning at 9:30 a.m. MDT in Salt Lake City, Utah.

The exchange of information and materials between the parties is informal. Only prehearing briefs are filed with the Office of the Secretary.
