ORDER POSTPONING HEARING
AND SCHEDULING PREHEARING
CONFERENCE

On August 27, 2014, the Securities and Exchange Commission (Commission) issued an Order Instituting Administrative Proceedings (OIP) against Clavis Technologies International Co., Ltd. (Clavis), pursuant to Section 12(j) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 (Exchange Act). The OIP alleges that Clavis has a class of securities registered with the Commission pursuant to Exchange Act Section 12(g) and is delinquent in its periodic filings, in violation of Exchange Act Section 13(a) and Rules 13a-1 and 13a-13 thereunder. A hearing is scheduled to commence on September 18, 2014.

On August 29, 2014, the Division of Enforcement (Division) filed the Declaration of David S. Frye to Assist Secretary with Record of Service (Declaration) and supporting exhibits. The Declaration represents that Clavis, a Nevada corporation, was served through its Nevada registered agent, Resident Agency National, by U.S. Priority Mail Express on August 28, 2014. Declaration Exhibit 1. USPS tracking confirms the Division's delivery representations. Declaration Exhibit 2. Thus, I find that Clavis was served with the OIP on August 28, 2014. *See* 17 C.F.R. § 201.141(a)(2)(ii).

It is ORDERED that the hearing scheduled for September 18, 2014, is POSTPONED *sine die*, and a telephonic prehearing conference shall be held on September 26, 2014, at 10:30 a.m. EDT, if the proceeding has not been resolved by then. If Respondent fails to timely file an Answer, participate in the prehearing conference, or otherwise defend this proceeding, it will be deemed in default, the proceeding will be determined against it, and the registration of its securities will be revoked. *See* OIP at 3; 17 C.F.R. §§ 201.155(a)(1)-(2), .220(f), .221(f).
