ORDER TO SHOW CAUSE

On August 27, 2014, the Securities and Exchange Commission (Commission) issued an Order Instituting Administrative Proceedings (OIP) against Xinde Technology Company (Xinde), pursuant to Section 12(j) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. The OIP alleges that Xinde has a class of securities registered with the Commission and is delinquent in its periodic filings. Xinde was served with the OIP on August 28, 2014, and its answer was due by September 10, 2014. *Xinde Tech. Co.*, Admin. Proc. Rulings Release No. 1757, 2014 SEC LEXIS 3193 (Sept. 4, 2014). To date, Xinde has not filed an answer.

Accordingly, it is ORDERED that on or before Monday, September 22, 2014, Xinde shall SHOW CAUSE why this proceeding should not be determined against it due to its failure to file an answer or otherwise defend this proceeding. *See* 17 C.F.R. §§ 201.155(a)(2), .220(f). If Xinde fails to respond to this Order, it shall be deemed in default, the proceeding will be determined against it, and the registration of its securities will be revoked. *See* OIP at 2; 17 C.F.R. § 201.155(a)(2).
