On June 2, 2015, the Securities and Exchange Commission issued an Order Instituting Administrative Proceedings (OIP) against Respondents, pursuant to Section 12(j) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. The OIP alleges that Respondents each have a class of securities registered with the Commission and are delinquent in their periodic filings.

The Division of Enforcement has filed supplemental declarations establishing that Respondents China Marketing Media Holdings, Inc., and Cigma Metals Corp. were served with the OIP by June 12, 2015. See 17 C.F.R. § 201.141(a)(2)(ii). Their Answers were due by June 22, 2015. See OIP at 3; 17 C.F.R. § 201.220(b). I previously found that Respondents Anticus International Corp. and LL&E Royalty Trust were served with the OIP by June 8, 2015, and because they were served by mail, their Answers were also due by June 22, 2015. Anticus Int'l Corp., Admin. Proc. Rulings Release No. 2799, 2015 SEC LEXIS 2311 (June 11, 2015); see 17 C.F.R. § 201.160(b). As of today, only LL&E Royalty Trust has filed an Answer.

It is ORDERED that Respondents Anticus International Corp., China Marketing Media Holdings, Inc., and Cigna Metals Corp. shall SHOW CAUSE by July 8, 2015, why the registrations of their securities should not be revoked by default due to their failure to file Answers or otherwise defend this proceeding. *See* 17 C.F.R. §§ 201.155(a)(2), .220(f). If these Respondents fail to respond to this Order, they will be deemed in default, the proceeding will be determined against them, and the registrations of their securities will be revoked. OIP at 3; 17 C.F.R. §§ 201.155(a), .220(f).
