PROTECTIVE ORDER

On June 26, 2015, Respondents Traci J. Anderson, CPA, and Timothy W. Carnahan each filed financial disclosure statements (Forms D-A) that they request be protected from public disclosure.

The Forms D-A contain sensitive personal and financial information (confidential information) and, at this stage in the proceeding, the harm resulting from complete public disclosure would outweigh the benefits of disclosure. *See* 17 C.F.R. § 201.322(b).

Accordingly, I ORDER as follows:

1. The Forms D-A shall be maintained under seal in the Commission's records and not disclosed to the public.
2. So long as the confidentiality is maintained, the Forms D-A may be disclosed to the parties to this proceeding, legal counsel, and any trial teams, including experts and contractors; the undersigned; the Securities and Exchange Commission; and employees, staff, and agents of the Commission.
3. The parties shall take reasonable and appropriate measures to prevent unauthorized disclosure of the Forms D-A and their contents. All persons who receive access to the Forms D-A shall keep them confidential and, except as provided in this Order, shall not divulge the confidential information.
4. If a party intends to make a filing (such as a brief or motion) that contains confidential information from the Forms D-A in this proceeding or any appeal therefrom, the party must: a) file a version clearly labeled "under seal" pursuant to this protective order; and b) file a public redacted version that removes the confidential information. If filing a public

redacted version is impracticable, then the party shall file only the “under seal” filing. A party need not redact the last four digits of a financial account number, business addresses, or business telephone numbers.

5. Any person requesting relief from, or modification of, this protective order may file an appropriate motion.
