ORDER TO SHOW CAUSE

The Securities and Exchange Commission instituted this proceeding with an Order Instituting Proceedings (OIP), pursuant to Section 12(j) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 (Exchange Act), on September 25, 2015. The OIP alleges that each Respondent is a corporation with a class of securities registered with the Commission pursuant to Section 12(g) of the Exchange Act and has repeatedly failed to file required periodic reports. The Division of Enforcement is seeking to revoke the registration of Respondents' securities.

The OIP provides that each Respondent's Answer is due within ten days of service of the OIP on it. *See* OIP at 3; 17 C.F.R. § 201.220(b). Each Respondent was each served with the OIP by October 7, 2015, by USPS Express Mail attempted delivery at "the most recent address shown on [its] most recent filing with the Commission." 17 C.F.R. § 201.141(a)(2)(ii). To date, each has failed to file an Answer within the time provided.

Accordingly, each Respondent is ORDERED TO SHOW CAUSE, by November 12, 2015, why it should not be deemed to be in default and the registration of its securities revoked. *See* OIP at 3; 17 C.F.R. §§ 201.155(a), .220(f).
