**EXTENSION ORDER** 

The hearing in this proceeding took place on June 15 and 16, 2016, at FCI Beaumont, Texas, where Respondent Gary L. McDuff is currently incarcerated.

On July 13, 2016, McDuff filed a letter, stating that he only a day earlier received the final two boxes of documents from the Division of Enforcement's investigative file and the full transcript of the hearing. He also stated that he may request an extension of the July 22 due date for the filing of post-hearing briefs. The Division has represented to my office that it would not oppose such an extension.

Accordingly, for good cause shown under 17 C.F.R. § 201.161, the post-hearing briefing schedule is amended as follows:

The Division of Enforcement and Respondent shall file simultaneous opening post-hearing briefs by August 12, 2016, and any responsive briefs by September 9, 2016. Proposed findings of fact and conclusions of law are optional; if any are filed, they are due by August 12, 2016.

The parties shall file declarations by August 12, 2016, describing their respective efforts to facilitate, and the results of, receiving, transmitting, disseminating, making available, and generally handling the investigative file, and any other pertinent matters concerning preparation for the hearing. The parties may file responsive briefs and declarations on this issue, which may be incorporated into their responsive post-hearing briefs, by September 9, 2016.

The remainder of the post-hearing schedule, as described in my June 22, 2016, order, remains unchanged. *See Gary L. McDuff*, Admin. Proc. Rulings Release No. 3934, 2016 SEC LEXIS 2191.
