ORDER TO SHOW CAUSE,  
CANCELING PREHEARING  
CONFERENCE, AND SETTING  
DIVISION'S MOTION DEADLINE

On January 24, 2017, the Securities and Exchange Commission issued an order instituting proceedings (OIP) against Respondents. Interinvest Corporation, Inc., was served with the OIP on January 30, 2017, and its answer was due February 22, 2017. *Hans Peter Black*, Admin. Proc. Rulings Release No. 4623, 2017 SEC LEXIS 568 (ALJ Feb. 23, 2017). It failed to file an answer and was ordered to show cause by March 6, 2017, why it should not be found in default. *Id.* It did not respond to that order. The other respondent, Hans Peter Black, was served on February 15, 2017, and his answer was due March 7, 2017. *Id.* He has failed to file an answer.

Accordingly, I ORDER Black to SHOW CAUSE by March 20, 2017, why he should not be found in default and this proceeding determined against him due to his failure to file an answer or otherwise defend the proceeding. OIP at 3; 17 C.F.R. §§ 201.155(a)(2), .220(f).

The Division of Enforcement shall submit a motion for default and sanctions against Respondents by April 14, 2017. The motion shall include legal analysis and evidentiary support for the allegations and requested sanction in accordance with *Rapoport v. SEC*, 682 F.3d 98 (D.C. Cir. 2012), and *Ross Mandell*, Exchange Act Release No. 71668, 2014 SEC LEXIS 849, at \*7-9 (Mar. 7, 2014), *vacated in part on other grounds*, Exchange Act Release No. 77935, 2016 SEC LEXIS 1886 (May 26, 2016). If Respondents are found in default, I may deem the OIP's allegations true and decide the proceeding against them. *See* OIP at 3; 17 C.F.R. § 201.155(a)(2).

I FURTHER ORDER that the prehearing conference scheduled for March 24, 2017, is CANCELED.
