UBIQUITY, INC.	:	

The Securities and Exchange Commission instituted this proceeding with an Order Instituting Proceedings (OIP), pursuant to Section 12(j) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, on March 20, 2017. The OIP alleges that Respondent is a corporation with a class of securities registered with the Commission pursuant to Section 12(g) of the Exchange Act and has repeatedly failed to file required periodic reports. Respondent filed its Answer to the OIP on April 7, 2017. The Division of Enforcement has filed a motion for summary disposition, pursuant to 17 C.F.R. § 201.250(b), requesting that the registration of Respondent’s securities be revoked. July 3, 2017, and July 10, 2017, were set as the due dates for Respondent’s opposition and the Division’s reply, respectively. *See Ubiquity, Inc.*, Admin. Proc. Rulings Release No. 4744, 2017 SEC LEXIS 1097 (A.L.J. Apr. 11, 2017).

Respondent, which has been delinquent in its periodic filings following its report for the quarter ended September 30, 2015, previously advised that it planned to become current by June 30, 2017. This did not occur. Instead, on June 29, 2017, Respondent filed a motion for extension of time until August 15, 2017, to file its opposition, by which time it now plans to become current. The motion states that Respondent’s progress was hampered by a series of “unfortunate events,” such as being locked out of its offices for two weeks, non-cooperation of outside vendors, and unavailability of key people. The motion will be granted in part and denied in part. A lengthy extension would be inconsistent with the timely resolution of this proceeding. 17 C.F.R. §§ 201.161(b)(1)(iv), .360(a)(2)(ii). It is noted that the occurrence of the unfortunate events to which the motion refers bodes ill for Respondent’s future compliance. Respondent’s opposition to the motion for summary disposition and the Division’s reply will be due July 10, 2017, and July 17, 2017, respectively.
