**Order Granting Motion
for Extension to Submit
New Evidence**

This administrative proceeding began with an order instituting proceedings issued on October 27, 2016. The proceeding is based on *SEC v. Snisky*, No. 13-cv-3149 (D. Colo. Aug. 12, 2016), in which Respondent is alleged to have been permanently enjoined from violating the registration and antifraud provisions of the federal securities laws. The proceeding was stayed from May 22, 2017, until November 30, 2017. *See Gary C. Snisky*, Admin. Proc. Rulings Release No. 4838, 2017 SEC LEXIS 1591 (ALJ May 30, 2017); *Pending Admin. Proc.*, Securities Act of 1933 Release No. 10440, 2017 SEC LEXIS 3724, at *4-5 (Nov. 30, 2017).

On December 15, 2017, I ordered Snisky to file any new evidence that he considered relevant to my reexamination of the record by January 5, 2018. *Gary C. Snisky*, Admin. Proc. Rulings Release No. 5393, 2017 SEC LEXIS 4114 (ALJ Dec. 15, 2017). On January 5, 2018, the Division filed a motion to ratify my prior orders. On January 22, 2018, Snisky filed a motion for extension of time stating that prison mail delays and the lack of library facilities have prevented him from meeting the January 5, 2018, deadline. Snisky requests an extension to January 29, 2018, to file new evidence.

Ruling

Snisky appears pro se and is incarcerated. The Division has not opposed the motion. For good cause shown, I GRANT the motion and ORDER that Snisky has until February 28, 2018, to file any new evidence that he considers relevant to my reexamination of the record and to respond to the Division's January 5 motion. I am granting a longer extension than Snisky

requested to provide him ample time to negotiate the vagaries of the prison mail system.

I FURTHER ORDER that if Snisky makes a filing, the Division has fifteen days following the filing to file a responsive brief, and I have until March 23, 2018, to issue an order regarding the ratification of all prior actions.
