June 22, 2018:	Filing of oppositions to Rule 250(c) motions
	Deadline for requests under Rule 232 for subpoenas requiring the attendance and testimony of a witness at the hearing

June 29, 2018:	Filing of replies in support of Rule 250(c) motions
July 6, 2018:	Filing of prehearing briefs, stipulations, and admissions of fact
July 11, 2018:	Exchange of premarked exhibits and final witness lists
	A final telephonic prehearing conference will be held at 2:00 p.m. EDT

The parties have advised that they will meet and confer to set a briefing schedule for motions in limine. The parties' proposed schedule should provide me time to rule on the motions in advance of the hearing, giving due regard to the number and complexity of the motions.
