Order to Show Cause

Yesterday, I held a prehearing conference attended only by the Division of Enforcement. The Division represented that it had not heard from Respondent. I previously found that Respondent was served with the order instituting proceedings. *Bryan Lee Addington*, Admin. Proc. Rulings Release No. 6158, 2018 SEC LEXIS 2780 (ALJ Oct. 10, 2018). His answer was due yesterday, and to date he has not filed an answer.

I ORDER Respondent to SHOW CAUSE by November 13, 2018, why he should not be found default due to his failure to file an answer, submit a proposal, attend the prehearing conference, or otherwise defend this proceeding. See Pending Admin. Proc., Securities Act of 1933 Release No. 10536, 2018 SEC LEXIS 2058, at *4 ("[I]f a party fails to submit a proposal, the ALJ may enter a default against that party..."); 17 C.F.R. §§ 201.155(a)(1)–(2), .220(f), .221(f).

By December 4, 2018, the Division shall file an appropriate dispositive motion. The motion should include a discussion of: (1) the relevant facts with citations to supporting evidence or documents; (2) the relevant law addressing, among any other issues, whether the legal basis for this action is satisfied; and (3) whether and what sanctions are in the public interest. Supporting evidence must be sufficient for the required analysis. See, e.g., Gary L. McDuff, Securities Exchange Act of 1934 Release No. 74803, 2015 SEC LEXIS 1657, at *7–14 (Apr. 23, 2015); Ross Mandell, Exchange Act Release No. 71668, 2014 SEC LEXIS 849, at *7–8 (Mar. 7, 2014), vacated in part on other grounds, Exchange Act Release No. 77935, 2016 SEC LEXIS 1886 (May 26, 2016).

In addition to the required filing with the Securities and Exchange Commission's Office of the Secretary, the Division should e-mail an electronic courtesy copy of all filings to alj@sec.gov in PDF text-searchable format. Exhibits should be sent as separate attachments, not a combined PDF.
