**Order Finding Service,
Directing Respondents
to Show Cause, and Scheduling
Prehearing Conference**

On September 14, 2017, the Securities and Exchange Commission issued an order instituting proceedings (OIP) pursuant to Section 12(j) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, alleging that Respondents have securities registered with the Commission and are delinquent in their periodic filings. After a prior initial decision was vacated by the Commission, the proceeding was reassigned to me on September 12, 2018. *Pending Admin. Proc.*, Admin. Proc. Rulings Release No. 5955, 2018 SEC LEXIS 2264, at *2-3 (ALJ). The parties were provided the opportunity to propose how further proceedings should be conducted. *China Hefeng Rescue Equip., Inc.*, Admin. Proc. Rulings Release No. 6055, 2018 SEC LEXIS 2518, at *1 (ALJ Sept. 21, 2018). No Respondent filed a proposal.

On October 19, 2017, the Division of Enforcement submitted two declarations, which I have independently reviewed, establishing that Respondents were served with the OIP on September 18, 2017. 17 C.F.R. § 201.141(a)(2)(ii), (iv).¹ No Respondent filed an answer.

¹ China Hefeng Rescue Equipment was served by delivery of the OIP to the Delaware Secretary of State as permitted by Delaware law. Del. Code tit. 8, § 321(b).

I ORDER Respondents to SHOW CAUSE by November 19, 2018, why the registration of their securities should not be revoked by default due to their failures to file answers or otherwise defend the proceeding. *See* OIP at 3; 17 C.F.R. §§ 201.155(a), .220(f).

I FURTHER ORDER that a telephonic prehearing conference shall be held December 17, 2018, at 4:00 p.m. EST, if this matter has not been concluded by then.
