SEC, 682 F.3d 98, 108 (D.C. Cir. 2012), and Ross Mandell, Securities Exchange Act of 1934 Release No. 71668, 2014 WL 907416, at *2 (Mar. 7, 2014), vacated in part on other grounds, Exchange Act Release No. 77935, 2016 WL 3030883 (May 26, 2016).
