I previously found that Respondent was served with the order instituting proceedings on November 8, 2018, and that his answer and proposal for the conduct of further proceedings was due by December 3, 2018. *Gregory Reyftmann*, Admin. Proc. Rulings Release No. 6328, 2018 SEC LEXIS 3223 (Nov. 15, 2018). Respondent has not answered or filed a proposal.

I ORDER Respondent to SHOW CAUSE by December 24, 2018, why he should not be found in default due to his failure to file an answer, submit a proposal, or otherwise defend this proceeding. *See Pending Admin. Proc.*, Securities Act of 1933 Release No. 10536, 2018 SEC LEXIS 2058, at \*4 ("[I]f a party fails to submit a proposal, the ALJ may enter a default against that party . . ."); 17 C.F.R. §§ 201.155(a)(2), .220(f).

In the event that Respondent fails to respond to this order, the Division of Enforcement shall file a motion for default and sanctions by January 7, 2019. The motion may incorporate the arguments and exhibits filed on August 11, 2017.

In addition to the required filing with the Securities and Exchange Commission's Office of the Secretary, the Division should e-mail an electronic courtesy copy of all filings to alj@sec.gov in PDF text-searchable format. Exhibits should be sent as separate attachments, not a combined PDF.
