**Protective Order** 

The Division of Enforcement has renewed its motion for a protective order governing the documents in its investigative file to be produced to Respondent Gary C. Snisky. The Division represents that redaction of the personally identifiable information and other sensitive information from the documents is impracticable, given the size of the file and the prevalence of such information. I find that the harm resulting from disclosure of such information would outweigh any concomitant benefits. 17 C.F.R. § 201.322(b). In his motion for discovery, Snisky agreed to keep the file confidential under terms substantially similar to the Division's current proposed order. Therefore, the Division's motion is GRANTED.

Snisky shall keep the documents produced to him confidential and shall in no way disclose them or divulge their contents to any person, except to counsel, to whom the records and their contents shall be disclosed solely for the purpose of properly preparing for and trying this matter or any related court proceeding.

The terms of this protective order do not preclude, limit, restrict, or otherwise apply to the use of documents at any hearing, prehearing conference, or submission to my office.
