**Order Denying
Motion for Stay**

Respondent Mark Feathers again moves for a stay of this proceeding. In his motion, he asserts that he has been “beset by” a “chronic and debilitating” medical condition “since shortly after the onset of these proceedings.” Feathers says his circumstance is exacerbated by an additional “irreversible ... condition.” Based on these assertions, he asks that I stay this proceeding “[u]ntil [he] ... is no longer suffering from [his] chronic and debilitating” medical condition.

Feathers’s motion is denied. Without questioning the debilitating nature of Feathers’s condition, he is asking for open-ended stay, which is prohibited.¹ Moreover, the number of filings he has submitted over the last three months suggests that his condition does not impede his ability to participate in this proceeding.
