The Securities and Exchange Commission instituted this proceeding with an Order Instituting Proceedings (OIP) on September 6, 2022, which was served on Respondent Electropremium by personal service on September 7, 2022. The proceeding is a stop order proceeding, authorized pursuant to Section 8(d) of the Securities Act of 1933, concerning a Form S-1 Registration Statement filed by Electropremium. The OIP ordered Electropremium to file an Answer within ten days after service of the OIP and ordered that a hearing commence at 10:00 a.m. EDT on September 21, 2022, via remote means and/or at the Commission's offices at 100 F Street, N.E., Washington, DC 20549, "to determine whether the allegations of the Division of Enforcement are true; to afford the Respondent with an opportunity to establish any defenses to these allegations; and to determine whether a stop order should issue suspending the effectiveness of the Registration Statement." OIP at 2-3. Respondent neither filed an Answer nor appeared at the hearing, which was held as scheduled via remote means.

The OIP instructed that all papers "shall be filed electronically in administrative proceedings using the Commission's Electronic Filings in Administrative Proceedings (eFAP) system access through the Commission's website, www.sec.gov, at <http://www.sec.gov/eFAP>." OIP at 3 (citing 17 C.F.R. § 201.151(a), (b), (c)). After the hearing concluded, the Office of Administrative Law Judges received at least two emails from Respondent that were not filed in eFAP.

In order for the undersigned or the Commission to consider any submission from Respondent, it must be filed in eFAP. Submissions that are not filed in eFAP are not part of the record in this proceeding and will not be considered.
