FINAL JUDGMENT
AS TO
MALHAZ PINHAS
PATARKAZISHVILI
AND
SPOT OPTION, LTD.

1 The Securities and Exchange Commission has filed a Complaint against
2 Defendants Malhaz Pinhas Patarkazishvili (“Pini Peter”) and Spot Option, Ltd., now
3 known as Spot Tech House, Ltd. (“Spot Option”). Pini Peter and Spot Option, failed
4 to appear or otherwise respond to the Complaint and the Clerk entered an order of
5 default against them on October 29, 2021. ECF No. 12. The SEC filed a Motion
6 for Entry of a Default Judgment against both Pini Peter and Spot Option, ECF No.
7 16, who did not oppose the motion or otherwise respond.

8 Having reviewed the SEC’s Motion for Entry of a Default Judgment, and being
9 duly advised, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, ADJUDGED, AND DECREED that the
10 SEC’s Motion for Entry of a Default Judgment against Pini Peter and Spot Option is
11 GRANTED.

12 **I.**

13 IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED, AND DECREED that
14 Defendants Spot Option and Pini Peter are permanently restrained and enjoined from
15 violating, directly or indirectly, Section 10(b) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934
16 (the “Exchange Act”) [15 U.S.C. § 78j(b)] and Rule 10b-5 promulgated thereunder
17 [17 C.F.R. § 240.10b-5], by using any means or instrumentality of interstate
18 commerce, or of the mails, or of any facility of any national securities exchange, in
19 connection with the purchase or sale of any security:

- 20 (a) to employ any device, scheme, or artifice to defraud;
- 21 (b) to make any untrue statement of a material fact or to omit to state a
22 material fact necessary in order to make the statements made, in the light
23 of the circumstances under which they were made, not misleading; or
- 24 (c) to engage in any act, practice, or course of business which operates or
25 would operate as a fraud or deceit upon any person.

26 IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED, AND DECREED that, as provided
27 in Federal Rule of Civil Procedure 65(d)(2), the foregoing paragraph also binds the
28 following who receive actual notice of this Final Judgment by personal service or

1 otherwise: (a) Defendant’s officers, agents, servants, employees, and attorneys; and
2 (b) other persons in active concert or participation with Defendant or with anyone
3 described in (a).

4 **II.**

5 IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED, AND DECREED that
6 Defendant Spot Option is permanently restrained and enjoined from violating Section
7 17(a) of the Securities Act of 1933 (the “Securities Act”) [15 U.S.C. § 77q(a)] in the
8 offer or sale of any security by the use of any means or instruments of transportation
9 or communication in interstate commerce or by use of the mails, directly or indirectly:

- 10 (a) to employ any device, scheme, or artifice to defraud;
11 (b) to obtain money or property by means of any untrue statement of a
12 material fact or any omission of a material fact necessary in order to make
13 the statements made, in light of the circumstances under which they were
14 made, not misleading; or
15 (c) to engage in any transaction, practice, or course of business which
16 operates or would operate as a fraud or deceit upon the purchaser.

17 IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED, AND DECREED that, as provided
18 in Federal Rule of Civil Procedure 65(d)(2), the foregoing paragraph also binds the
19 following who receive actual notice of this Final Judgment by personal service or
20 otherwise: (a) Defendant’s officers, agents, servants, employees, and attorneys; and
21 (b) other persons in active concert or participation with Defendant or with anyone
22 described in (a).

23 **III.**

24 IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED, AND DECREED that
25 Defendants Spot Option and Pini Peter are permanently restrained and enjoined from
26 violating Section 5 of the Securities Act [15 U.S.C. § 77e] by, directly or indirectly, in
27 the absence of any applicable exemption:

- 28 (a) Unless a registration statement is in effect as to a security, making use of

1 any means or instruments of transportation or communication in interstate
2 commerce or of the mails to sell such security through the use or medium
3 of any prospectus or otherwise;

4 (b) Unless a registration statement is in effect as to a security, carrying or
5 causing to be carried through the mails or in interstate commerce, by any
6 means or instruments of transportation, any such security for the purpose
7 of sale or for delivery after sale; or

8 (c) Making use of any means or instruments of transportation or
9 communication in interstate commerce or of the mails to offer to sell or
10 offer to buy through the use or medium of any prospectus or otherwise
11 any security, unless a registration statement has been filed with the
12 Commission as to such security, or while the registration statement is the
13 subject of a refusal order or stop order or (prior to the effective date of the
14 registration statement) any public proceeding or examination under
15 Section 8 of the Securities Act [15 U.S.C. § 77h].

16 IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED, AND DECREED that, as provided
17 in Federal Rule of Civil Procedure 65(d)(2), the foregoing paragraph also binds the
18 following who receive actual notice of this Final Judgment by personal service or
19 otherwise: (a) Defendant's officers, agents, servants, employees, and attorneys; and
20 (b) other persons in active concert or participation with Defendant or with anyone
21 described in (a).

22 **IV.**

23 IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED, AND DECREED that pursuant to
24 Section 21(d)(5) of the Exchange Act [15 U.S.C. § 78u(d)(5)], Defendant Pini Peter is
25 permanently restrained and enjoined from directly or indirectly, including, but not
26 limited to, through any entity owned or controlled by him, participating in the purchase,
27 offer or sale of any security; provided, however, that such injunction shall not prevent
28 him from purchasing or selling securities for his own personal account.

1 IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED, AND DECREED that, as provided
2 in Federal Rule of Civil Procedure 65(d)(2), the foregoing paragraph also binds the
3 following who receive actual notice of this Final Judgment by personal service or
4 otherwise: (a) Defendant's officers, agents, servants, employees, and attorneys; and
5 (b) other persons in active concert or participation with Defendant or with anyone
6 described in (a).

7 V.

8 IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED, AND DECREED that
9 Defendant Spot Option is liable for disgorgement of \$56,460,888.04, representing
10 net profits gained as a result of the conduct alleged in the Complaint, together with
11 prejudgment interest thereon in the amount of \$17,885,590.18, and a civil penalty in
12 the amount of \$66,298,176 pursuant to Section 20 of the Securities Act [15 U.S.C. §§
13 77t(d)(2)(C)] and Section 21 of the Exchange Act [15 U.S.C. §78u(d)(3)(B)(iii)].
14 Defendant Spot Option shall satisfy this obligation by paying \$140,644,654.22
15 to the Securities and Exchange Commission within 30 days after entry of this Final
16 Judgment.

17 IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED, AND DECREED that, pursuant to
18 Section 20(a) of the Exchange Act [15 U.S.C. § 78t(a)], Defendant Pini Peter is liable
19 to the same extent as Spot Option for disgorgement of \$56,460,888.04, representing net
20 profits gained by Spot Option as a result of the conduct alleged in the Complaint,
21 together with prejudgment interest thereon in the amount of \$17,885,590.18, and a civil
22 penalty in the amount of \$13,254,592 pursuant to Section 20 of the Securities Act
23 [15 U.S.C. §§ 77t(d)(2)(C)] and Section 21 of the Exchange Act [15
24 U.S.C. §78u(d)(3)(B)(iii)]. Defendant Pini Peter shall satisfy this obligation by
25 paying \$87,601,070.22 to the Securities and Exchange Commission within 30 days
26 after entry of this Final Judgment.

27 Defendants may transmit payment electronically to the Commission, which will
28 provide detailed ACH transfer/Fedwire instructions upon request. Payment may also
be made directly from a bank account via Pay.gov through the SEC website at

2 check, bank cashier's check, or United States postal money order payable to the
3 Securities and Exchange Commission, which shall be delivered or mailed to

8 and shall be accompanied by a letter identifying the case title, civil action number, and
9 name of this Court; the paying Defendant's name; and specifying that payment is made
10 pursuant to this Final Judgment.

11 Defendants shall simultaneously transmit photocopies of evidence of payment
12 and case identifying information to the Commission's counsel in this action. By
13 making this payment, Defendants relinquish all legal and equitable right, title, and
14 interest in such funds and no part of the funds shall be returned to Defendants.

15 The Commission may enforce the Court's judgment for disgorgement and
16 prejudgment interest by using all collection procedures authorized by law, including,
17 but not limited to, moving for civil contempt at any time after 30 days following entry
18 of this Final Judgment.

19 The Commission may enforce the Court's judgment for penalties by the use of
20 all collection procedures authorized by law, including the Federal Debt Collection
21 Procedures Act, 28 U.S.C. § 3001 *et seq.*, and moving for civil contempt for the
22 violation of any Court orders issued in this action.

23 Defendants shall pay post judgment interest on any amounts due after 30 days
24 of the entry of this Final Judgment pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 1961. The Commission
25 shall hold the funds, together with any interest and income earned thereon (collectively,
26 the "Fund"), pending further order of the Court.


27 The Commission may propose a plan to distribute the Fund subject to the Court's
28 approval. Such a plan may provide that the Fund shall be distributed pursuant to the

1 laws or any regulation or order issued under such laws, as set forth in Section
2 523(a)(19) of the Bankruptcy Code, 11 U.S.C. §523(a)(19).

3 **VII.**

4 IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED, AND DECREED that this Court
5 shall retain jurisdiction of this matter for the purposes of enforcing the terms of this
6 Final Judgment.
