**AGREED ORDER OF PERMANENT INJUNCTION AND
OTHER EQUITABLE RELIEF AGAINST STEVEN MCMICHAEL**

Plaintiff Securities and Exchange Commission ("Commission") has filed a Complaint seeking permanent injunctions and other equitable relief ("Complaint") in this matter and Defendant Steven McMichael (McMichael) has, in his Consent and Stipulation attached hereto and incorporated herein, acknowledged receipt of the Complaint, admitted the jurisdiction of this Court over him, and without admitting or denying the allegations of the Complaint except as to jurisdiction, and without trial, argument or adjudication of any facts or law herein, consented to the entry of this Agreed Order of Permanent Injunction and Other Equitable Relief (Order). The Commission and Defendant McMichael have waived the entry of findings of fact and conclusions of law. The Court having jurisdiction over the parties and the subject matter hereof, and being fully advised in the premises:

I.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED that Defendant McMichael, his agents, servants, employees, attorneys, and those persons in active concert or participation with him who receive actual notice of this Order by personal service or otherwise, and each of them, be and are hereby permanently restrained and enjoined from, directly or indirectly, in connection with the purchase or sale of securities of any issuer, by the use of any means or instrumentality of interstate commerce, or of the mails, or of any facility of any national securities exchange:

- A. employing any device, scheme or artifice to defraud;
- B. making any untrue statement of a material fact or omitting to state a material fact necessary in order to make the statements made, in the light of the circumstances under which they were made, not misleading; or
- C. engaging in any act, practice, or course of business which operates or would operate as a fraud or deceit upon any person.

II.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED that Defendant McMichael, his agents, servants, employees, attorneys, and those persons in active concert or participation with him who receive actual notice of this Order by personal service or otherwise, and each of them, be and are hereby permanently restrained and enjoined from, directly or indirectly, in the offer or sale of securities of any issuer, by the use of any means or instruments of transportation or communication in interstate commerce or by the use of the mails, employing any device, scheme or artifice to defraud.

III.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED that Defendant McMichael, his agents, servants, employees, attorneys, and those persons in active concert or participation with him who receive actual notice of this Order by personal service or otherwise, and each of them, be and are hereby permanently restrained and enjoined from, directly or indirectly, in the offer or sale of securities of any issuer, by the use of any means or instruments of transportation or communication in interstate commerce or by the use of the mails, engaging in any transaction, practice, or course of business which operates or would operate as a fraud or deceit upon purchasers or prospective purchasers of such securities, or obtaining money or property by means of any untrue statement of a material fact or omitting to state a material fact necessary in order to make the statements made, in the light of the circumstances under which they were made, not misleading.

IV.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED that this Court shall retain jurisdiction of this matter for all purposes, including, but not limited to, determining the appropriate amount, if any, of disgorgement, prejudgment interest thereon and civil penalties. In this respect, Defendant McMichael may not by way of defense to a petition by Plaintiff for such relief, contest the allegations in the Complaint or assert that disgorgement or civil penalties are inappropriate for the violations alleged in the Complaint. However, Defendant McMichael is not precluded from advising the Court of mitigating circumstances.

V.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED that Defendant McMichael shall remain subject to the jurisdiction of this Court for the purpose of discovery regarding any unresolved issues in the case with respect to himself or any other Defendant.

VI.



IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED that there being no just cause for delay, the Clerk of the Court is hereby directed to enter this Order.
