Respondent's Motion for Court Order to Direct SEC to Post Prior Motions re: Feathers 3-15755

In starting his preparations to reply to Enforcement's 7-31-20 filing of a motion for summary disposition, Respondent noticed on the date of 8-1-20, while he was on SEC's web portal, for matters related to OIP 3-15755, that it appears that from the date of 6-25-20, and on thru this date, Respondent's motion filings are now being posted by SEC.

Prior, in his filings with this Court, Respondent asked this court to take note that Court orders were being posted, but not Respondent's motion filings on which the court was making decisions. Respondent stated in his prior filings with this court his belief that the public would benefit by seeing Respondent's filings, and that, on appearance, the Court was providing "PR" favorable for SEC by not publishing Respondent's filings.

Respondent asks this court now to direct SEC to post all of Respondent's motion filings from the commencement of this OIP, not just those filings from the date of 6-25-20, and forward.

On this date, Respondent has also submitted a FOIA request (see attached) to SEC to determine exactly why, from 6-25-20 forward, it has started to post Respondent's motion filings. Respondent and the public should be provided knowledge for this change in SEC/court procedures.
