DIVISION OF ENFORCEMENT'S RESPONSE TO RESPONDENT'S MOTION FOR REVIEW OF INITIAL DECISION 5-10-16

The Division of Enforcement ("Division") hereby responds to Respondent James Michael Murray's Motion for Review of Initial Decision 5-10-16 ("Motion"). Respondent claims to have sent the Motion within 21 days of the August 22, 2016 denial of his motion to correct but the Division just received the Motion on September 30, 2016. Nevertheless, the Division will not offer a substantive opposition except as directed by the Commission, but responds that the Motion does not offer any basis that warrants the exercise of discretion to grant review of the Initial Decision. Specifically, the Motion does not make a reasonable showing that a prejudicial error was committed in the conduct of the proceeding, nor a reasonable showing that the Initial Decision embodies a finding or conclusion of material fact that is clearly erroneous, a conclusion of law that is erroneous, or an exercise or discretion or decision of law or policy that is important and that the Commission should review. *See* SEC Rule of Practice 411(b)(2). The Motion should therefore be denied, and the related Rule 452 Motion to Adduce Additional Evidence, filed concurrently, should be denied as moot.
