DECLARATION OF GLYNNIS KIRCHMEIER


I, GLYNNIS KIRCHMEIER, declare:

1. I am a paralegal in FINRA's Member Supervision-Shared Services department ("Shared Services"). I have personal knowledge of the matters set forth in this declaration.
2. Shared Services receives Membership Continuance applications submitted by FINRA member firms seeking to become associated with, or continue to associate with, statutorily disqualified persons. In the ordinary course of its business, Shared Services maintains records of the Membership Continuance applications it receives.
3. The table below shows, on a year-by-year basis, the number of Membership Continuance applications that Shared Services received between January 1, 2015, and November 6, 2018.¹
