**DECLARATION OF GINA JOYCE**  
**TO ASSIST SECRETARY WITH RECORD OF SERVICE**

GINA JOYCE, pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 1746, declares:

1. I am a Senior Counsel with the Division of Enforcement (“Division”) of the Securities and Exchange Commission, and co-counsel for the Division in the captioned administrative proceeding. I am submitting this Declaration to assist the Secretary in maintaining a record of service on the Respondent in the captioned proceedings pursuant to Rule 141(a)(3).

2. Among other means, Securities and Exchange Commission (“Commission”) Rule of Practice 141(a)(2)(ii) permits service on a corporation or entity by delivering a copy of an Order Instituting Administrative Proceedings (“OIP”) to an agent authorized by appointment or law to receive such service or, in the case of an issuer with a class of securities registered with the Commission, by sending the OIP via U.S. Postal Service certified, registered, or express mail and obtaining a confirmation of attempted delivery on the most recent address shown on the entity’s most recent filing with the Commission.

Further, the OIP in this matter authorizes service of the OIP “by any means permitted by the Commission’s Rules of Practice.”

3. In order to determine if mail service is an acceptable means of service in Anguilla, British West Indies, a territory of the United Kingdom, I determined that both the United Kingdom and the United States are signatories to the Hague Convention on the Service Abroad of Judicial and Extradjudicial Documents in Civil or Commercial Matters (“The Hague Convention”), 20 U.S.T. 361, T.I.A.S. 6638, 658 U.N.T.A. 163 (1964). Article 10(a) of the Hague Convention provides that, unless the country of destination objects, parties may send judicial documents directly to persons abroad through postal channels. The United Kingdom does not object to such service. *La Dolce Vita Fine Dining Company Limited v. Zhang Lan*, 2020 WL 7321366 at \*6 (S.D.N.Y. Dec. 11, 2020). Therefore, the Division asked the Commission’s Secretary to first attempt service on the Respondent via Registered Mail International.

4. The Office of the Secretary provided me with the Registered Mail International tracking number for the copy of the Order Instituting Proceedings (“OIP”)<sup>1</sup> that was mailed by the Secretary to the Respondent in these proceedings. I input the tracking number into the package tracking system of the U.S. Postal Service (“USPS”) on its Internet website located at [www.usps.com](http://www.usps.com), and printed out the tracking confirmation in order to obtain confirmation of the delivery or attempted delivery of the OIP on the Respondent. A true copy of the tracking confirmations for the Respondent on which Registered Mail International service was attempted are attached as Exhibits 1 and 2, hereto.

5. On or about September 6, 2024, the Secretary mailed the OIP to Respondent Rhino Biotech Ltd. (f/k/a Eurasia Energy Ltd.), CIK 1278465 (“RBRXF”), via Registered Mail International, Tracking No. RF 592 996 954 US, to the address shown on its most recent EDGAR filing at 294 Heywood House, South Hill, 1A AI-2640, Anguilla, British West Indies. This address is taken from RBRXF’s last filing with the Commission, which was a Form 12b-25 filed with the Commission on May 2, 2024. The USPS tracking system confirms that as of September 26, 2024, the OIP package was still in transit. *See Exhibit 1.*

6. On or about September 12, 2024, the Secretary mailed another copy of the OIP to RBRXF via Registered Mail International, Tracking No. RF 592 996 968 US to the address above. The USPS tracking system confirms that as of September 26, 2024, the OIP package was still in transit. *See Exhibit 2.*

7. Since Exhibits 1 and 2 confirm that as of Thursday, September 26, 2024, USPS had not yet attempted to serve RBRXF, I requested that the SEC’s Mailroom send the OIP and party letter to RBRXF by express mail, specifically Global Express Guaranteed, to the address above. A true copy of the Global Express Guaranteed tracking label, USPS Tracking No. 834 434 7863/ FedEx Tracking No. 8983 4434 7862, is attached hereto as Exhibit 3.

8. A true copy of the tracking confirmation for the Respondent on which Global Express Guaranteed service was attempted is attached as Exhibit 4, hereto. Exhibit 4 confirms that delivery of the OIP package was attempted on October 3 and 4, 2024, and also on October 7 and 8, 2024, but the business was closed.

9. Exhibits 5 and 6 confirm that the OIPs sent by registered mail on September 6 and 12, 2024, respectively, are still in transit as of today, Wednesday October 9, 2024, and that no service attempt has been made by registered mail.

I declare under penalty of perjury that the foregoing is true and correct.
