Pursuant to Commission Rule of Practice 411,<sup>1</sup> the petition of Daniel Imperato for review of the administrative law judge's initial decision is granted. In addressing the issues raised by Imperato's petition, the parties are also directed to address the question of whether the initial decision should be summarily affirmed pursuant to Rule of Practice 411(e)<sup>2</sup> Pursuant to Rule of Practice 411(d),<sup>3</sup> the Commission will determine what sanctions, if any, are appropriate in this matter.

Accordingly, IT IS ORDERED, pursuant to Rule of Practice 450(a),<sup>4</sup> that a brief in support of the petition for review shall be filed by October 3, 2014. A brief in opposition

shall be filed by November 3, 2014, and any reply brief shall be filed by November 17, 2014.<sup>5</sup> Pursuant to Rule of Practice 180(c),<sup>6</sup> failure to file a brief in support of the petition may result in dismissal of this review proceeding as to that petitioner.
