ORDER SCHEDULING BRIEFS ON REMAND

On August 29, 2013, the Commission issued an order dismissing an application for review of FINRA disciplinary action against Sharemaster, a FINRA member firm and a registered broker-dealer, after concluding that it lacked jurisdiction under Section 19(d) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 over Sharemaster's application for review.¹ On February 2, 2017, the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Ninth Circuit remanded the matter to the Commission.² In light of the remand, the parties are directed to file briefs addressing, among other matters, the Commission's jurisdiction over Sharemaster's application for review in light of the Ninth Circuit's decision and the merits of Sharemaster's petition for review.

Accordingly, IT IS ORDERED, pursuant to Rule 450(a) of the Rules of Practice,³ that a brief in support of the application for review shall be filed by May 17, 2017. A brief in opposition shall be filed by June 16, 2017, and any reply brief shall be filed by June 30, 2017.⁴
