ORDER REGARDING SERVICE

The Securities and Exchange Commission ("Commission") issued an order instituting administrative proceedings ("OIP") on March 24, 2020, pursuant to Section 203(f) of the Investment Advisers Act of 1940, against Nicholas J. Genovese.¹

On July 15, 2021, the Commission issued an order directing that the Division of Enforcement provide proof that the OIP was served on Genovese by filing a declaration of service attaching such proof by August 12, 2021.² To date, the Division has not filed a declaration of service.

Accordingly, it is ORDERED that, if the Division has obtained proof of service, it file a declaration attaching such proof by November 1, 2021; and, if the Division has not obtained proof of service, it file a status report concerning service of the OIP by November 1, 2021, and every 28 days thereafter until it obtains such proof.
