ORDER GRANTING AN EXTENSION OF TIME

On February 8, 2022, the Securities and Exchange Commission (“Commission”) issued an order instituting administrative proceedings (“OIP”) against Liberated Syndication Inc., pursuant to Section 12(j) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934.¹ On February 11, 2022, the Commission granted Liberated Syndication Inc. an extension of time to file its answer to the OIP.² On March 15, 2022, Liberated Syndication Inc., filed a second request for an extension of time to file an answer to the OIP through and including April 22, 2022. Liberated Syndication Inc. cites the fact that “the OIP was issued while Liberated was engaged in several other pressing matters” as well as the fact that “they require additional time [to] continue its investigation and consider alternatives to remaining registered” as justification for the extension.

On March 18, 2020, the Commission issued an order providing that, pending further order of the Commission, reasonable requests for extensions of time will not be disfavored as stated in Commission Rule of Practice 161.³ Under the circumstances, it appears appropriate to grant the requested extension for good cause shown.⁴
