ORDER GRANTING AN EXTENSION OF TIME

On April 6, 2022, the Securities and Exchange Commission issued an order requesting that the parties file briefs by April 20, 2022, concerning whether pursuant to Commission Rule of Practice 201(a) it is appropriate to consolidate this proceeding with the proceeding instituted against World Tree Financial, LLC.¹ On April 20, 2022, respondent Wesley Kyle Perkins ("Respondent") filed an unopposed motion requesting that we extend the time to file briefs concerning consolidation until May 20, 2022.²

On March 18, 2020, the Commission issued an order providing that, pending further order of the Commission, reasonable requests for extensions of time will not be disfavored as stated in Commission Rule of Practice 161.³ It appears appropriate to grant the requested extension for good cause shown.⁴

The Division of Enforcement filed its brief concerning consolidation on April 20, 2022. Also, on April 14, 2022, the parties filed a joint prehearing conference statement that, among other things, included a proposed summary disposition schedule by the Division. The Commission will address the proposed schedule after it addresses consolidation.
