ORDER REGARDING SERVICE

The Securities and Exchange Commission (“Commission”) issued an Order Instituting Proceedings (“OIP”), on September 23, 2022, pursuant to Section 12(j) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, against respondent Generex Biotechnology Corporation (“Respondent”).<sup>1</sup> It appears that there have been no filings in this proceeding since issuance of the OIP, including as to whether the OIP was served upon Respondent. To assist the Office of the Secretary in maintaining a record of service that establishes that the OIP has been properly served,<sup>2</sup> IT IS ORDERED that the Division of Enforcement file a status report concerning service of the OIP by October 26, 2022, and every 28 days thereafter until service is accomplished.
