ORDER REGARDING SERVICE

The Securities and Exchange Commission (“Commission”) issued an Order Instituting Proceedings (“OIP”) on September 22, 2022, pursuant to Section 12(j) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, against WATER NOW, INC. (“Respondent”).¹

On October 14, 2022, the Division of Enforcement filed a declaration stating that the OIP was served on Respondent by sending it via Priority Mail Express to an address in Fort Worth, Texas, found on Respondent’s most recent filing with the Commission, a Form 8-K filed on July 13, 2022. However, according to the Form 8-K, the Fort Worth address was Respondent’s former address, and its current address is in Arlington, Texas. Therefore, it appears that the record does not establish that service of the OIP has been accomplished.

To assist the Office of the Secretary in maintaining a record of service that establishes that the OIP has been properly served,² IT IS ORDERED that the Division of Enforcement file a status report concerning service of the OIP by November 29, 2022, and every 28 days thereafter until service is accomplished.

The parties’ attention is directed to the most recent amendments to the Commission’s Rules of Practice, which took effect on April 12, 2021, and which include e-filing requirements.³
