ORDER GRANTING
PETITION FOR REVIEW
AND SCHEDULING BRIEFS

Pursuant to Commission Rule of Practice 411,¹ the petition of Electropremium for review of the administrative law judge's initial decision² is granted. Pursuant to Rule of Practice 411(d),³ the Commission will determine what sanctions, if any, are appropriate in this matter.

Accordingly, IT IS ORDERED, pursuant to Rule of Practice 450(a),⁴ that a brief in support of the petition for review shall be filed by February 16, 2023. A brief in opposition shall be filed by March 20, 2023, and any reply brief shall be filed by April 3, 2023.⁵ Pursuant to Rule
