ORDER DIRECTING STATUS REPORT FROM THE DIVISION OF ENFORCEMENT

The Securities and Exchange Commission issued an order instituting administrative proceedings (“OIP”) on September 27, 2022, pursuant to Section 15(b) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, against Christopher Byungin Lee.¹ It appears that, other than notices of appearance by Division of Enforcement counsel, there have been no filings in this proceeding since issuance of the OIP, including as to whether the OIP was served upon Lee.

On February 14, 2023, the Commission issued an Order Regarding Service.² The order directed the Division of Enforcement to file a status report concerning service of the OIP by February 28, 2023, and every 28 days thereafter until service is accomplished.³ To date, no such status report has been filed, nor has the Division otherwise responded to the February 14 order.

Accordingly, IT IS ORDERED that the Division of Enforcement file a status report concerning service of the OIP by June 27, 2023, and every 28 days thereafter until service is accomplished.
