ORDER REGARDING STATUS REPORT

The Securities and Exchange Commission issued an Order Instituting Proceedings (“OIP”) on August 16, 2022, pursuant to Section 12(j) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, against respondent Baynon International Corp. (“Respondent”).<sup>1</sup> On September 1, 2022, Respondent filed an answer to the OIP. On December 5, 2022, the parties submitted a joint statement regarding the prehearing conference, which represented that “[i]f this matter does not settle, the Division anticipates filing a motion for summary disposition.”

On February 22, 2023, the Division filed a status report stating that the parties “are discussing potential settlement.” On April 11, 2023, the Division filed another status report stating that the parties “are still engaged in settlement discussions” and that the Division would file another status report in thirty days if a settlement was not yet reached. To date, no additional status report or motion for summary disposition has been filed.

Accordingly, IT IS ORDERED that the parties file a status report, either jointly or separately, by June 28, 2023, and every 28 days thereafter, addressing whether additional time is needed regarding settlement efforts or whether the Commission should direct further action in this proceeding, such as by setting a schedule for the filing of motions for summary disposition. In the event it does not appear a settlement agreement will be reached, the parties should hold a subsequent prehearing conference within 14 days and, following the conference, promptly file a

statement advising the Commission of any agreement reached as well as the parties' positions on the subjects discussed.
