SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER REGARDING SERVICE

The Securities and Exchange Commission ("Commission") issued an order instituting administrative proceedings ("OIP") on July 7, 2022, pursuant to Section 203(f) of the Investment Advisers Act of 1940, against George McKown.¹ It appears that there have been no filings in this proceeding since issuance of the OIP, including as to whether the OIP was served upon McKown.

On October 17, 2022, the Commission issued an Order Regarding Service.² The order directed the Division of Enforcement to file a status report concerning service of the OIP by October 31, 2022, and every 28 days thereafter until service is accomplished.³ To date, no such status report has been filed, nor has the Division otherwise responded to the October 31 order.

Accordingly, IT IS ORDERED that the Division of Enforcement file a status report concerning service of the OIP by March 23, 2023, and every 28 days thereafter until service is accomplished.
