Client Relationship Summary – September 2024

Truvius ("Truvius" or "we") is a Securities and Exchange Commission ("SEC") registered investment adviser. Our fees and services differ from broker fees, and you need to understand the differences. This *Client Relationship Summary* ("Form CRS") informs you about our advisory services and the fees we charge. What investment services and advice can you provide me?

We offer investment advisory services to retail investors. Truvius provides portfolio management services via an interactive web platform ("The Platform"). This entails the use of algorithm-based portfolio management advice, rather than in-person investment advice.

These automated investment solutions are intended to provide options for clients to align their chosen investment strategy with their overall portfolio objectives, risk tolerance, etc.

We offer systematic investment portfolios, made up of readymade and customizable collections of digital assets, which are managed on a discretionary basis, and in accordance with the investment advisory agreement you have with us. This gives us the ability to create and manage the rules-based software that systematically determines the investments to buy and sell in your account on an ongoing basis.

You may formally request to impose certain restrictions relating to your investment. Generally, we require an initial minimum deposit of \$15,000 to activate trading. While there is no minimum account size to maintain an account, accounts with less than \$1,000 will generally not be rebalanced. What fees will I pay?

We generally receive compensation and fees based on a percentage of assets under management. The investment management fee charged by Truvius monthly is generally calculated based on the daily market value of the assets and the chosen investment product, deducted in aggregate on or around the tenth business day of the following month. In some cases, the method by which fees are calculated may be different, depending on the brokerage service.

- **Other Fees and Costs:** There are transactions costs associated with purchases or sales of certain assets via the brokers. Some brokers embed these transaction costs in the trade by earning from spreads. These transactions costs are usually small and incidental to the purchase or sale of a security. Custodians impose trading fees and a custody fee. Additional applicable fees may be borne in the normal course of business. We do not participate in a wrap fee program.
- **Commissions and Transaction Fees:** We do not receive commissions or transactions fees.

- Conflicts of Interest: The more assets you place under our management, the more you pay us in management fees (on a dollar basis, not a percentage basis). This gives us an incentive to encourage you to increase your assets under management, and may represent a conflict of interest in the event your investment outcomes do not align with your initial investment goals. (Note: Truvius may also provide fee discounts for meaningfully large accounts.)
- You will pay fees and costs whether you make or lose money on your investments. Fees and costs will reduce any amount of money you make on your investments over time. Please make sure you understand what fees and costs you are paying.

What are your legal obligations to me when acting as my investment adviser? How else does your firm make money and what conflicts of interest do you have?

When we act as your investment adviser, we have to act in your best interest and not put our interest ahead of yours.

At the same time, the way we make money creates some conflicts with your interests. You should understand and ask us about these conflicts because they can affect the investment advice we provide you. Since our revenue is based on the amount of client assets we manage, our financial professionals have an incentive to encourage clients to increase the assets in their accounts. This may represent a conflict of interest in the event your investment outcomes do not align with your initial investment goals.

How do your financial professionals make money?

The compensation Truvius pays its employees, including investment professionals, is indirectly derived from Truvius' revenues which include fees collected from Truvius' clients. This is further discussed above and disclosed in Item 5 of Truvius' Form ADV, Part 2A. As these fees are based on a percentage of assets under management, Truvius has an incentive to encourage clients to increase the assets in their accounts.
