The investment management services may be discretionary and non-discretionary based on the firm's investment process as deccribed below. Take into account individual client investment constraints. Application renders continous investment management services in a discretionary manner based on the strategies listed below, taking into account individual clients investment constraints, if any, set forth by the client in the Investment Advisory Agreement. The applicant also offers non-discretionary investment management by making investment recommendations for client approval using the same strategies.</p> <p>Equity Investments This strategy involves the direct purchase for the account of real estate in the client account. The account will invest 100% of the funds needed to acquire a particlar real estate asset. Typically these investments are held for a period of 5-7 years.</p> <p>Participating Mortgage Investments This strategy involves making and or participating in a mortgage loan from the client account to a selected borrower. The account will invest in participation with other lenders. The time frame for holding this type of the investment will vary depending on the investment objectives of the client.</p> <p>Fixed, Variable or Convertible Mortgage Investments This strategy involves making or participating in mortgage loans in the clients account with fixed, variable or convertible features. The account will invest in various types of the estate investments as a lender. Typically this type of investments will be held in a portfolio for 7-10 years.</p> <p>The annual fee schedule for each of the Applicant's strategies is as follows:</p> <p>Equity Investments 1.0% of the portfolio value. The annual fee is payable monthly based on an independent MAI appraisal conducted every three years.</p> <p>Participating Mortgage Investments 0.50% of the portfolio value The annual fee is payable monthly based on the lower of the principal balance or appraised value.</p> <p>Fixed, Variable or Convertible Mortgage Investments 0.125% of the outstanding principle balance The annual fee is payable monthly based on the outstanding balance as the end of each month.</p> <p>When a client opens an account a charge will be made at the end of each month based on prior the prior month's valuation or if an annual valuation is used based on that value divided by twelve. All fee are payable in arrears.</p> <p>Under certain circumstances, the amount of the fee and the timing of the payment may be negotiable. Any negotiable provisions will contained in the agreement executed by the client.</p> <p>A client may terminate his account at any time, effective upon written notice to the Applicant. Upon termination, unearned fees for the month will be prorated and refunded.</p>
